We, Your Paving Committee, heretofore appointed under the authority of the City Council and by the Mayor, beg leave to report, that under an ordinance passed on the 10th day of March 1905, and expired on the 11th day of March 1905, we, on the 10th day of October, 1905, issued to Mr. Butler notice to meet with the said paving committee on the 17th day of October, 1905, to notify him to appear before said committee on the 17th day of October, 1905, and to offer any objections he might have as to who will bid and contract for the paving of 9th Street and, especially, in front of the 10th Street and 7th Street, in Block 68, City of Austin, and it agrees with us that
