The Mayor laid before the Council a report from the
Chief of the Fire Dept, stating that he had authorized
the removal of the Chemical Tanks from Washington &
Colorado Fire Co's wagons and putting in place of these
tanks extinguishers of 3 gallons capacity - 2 to each wagon.
Alderman Moore moved to refer the communication
to the fire Committee which motion prevailed.
