Your special Committee on New City Hall to whom was referred the matter of securing quarters for City officials during the erection of the new City Hall beg leave to report that we have secured, subject to your approval, 11 rooms in the new Smith Opera House building on West 6th street, at a monthly cost of \$65.00. We think there will be ample room for the different offices, including the Corporation Court.
