In August 1999, the City Council created Tax Increment Financing Reinvestment Zone #15 (TIF#15) for the purpose of maintaining the plazas, streetscapes and other public improvements installed on Blocks 2 and 4 (CSC/Silicon Labs), Block 3 (City Hall), and Block 21 (Stratus)

This agreement will provide landscaping services at both City Hall and Municipal Building Services provided will be native landscape installation and maintenance Installation services will include remediation, to include any necessary replanting, and a one-time cleanup of the City Hall planting beds. The remediation and cleanup services will rely on the pre-existing native landscape plan for City Hall. Maintenance will include the monthly service of all landscaping areas at both City Hall and Municipal Building Allowances have been included for irrigation system repairs, arborist work, and the replacement of diseased or stressed plants.
