

The minutes of a called meeting of the City Council.

Austin Texas May 19. 1891

Hon John McDonald, Mayor, Presiding.
Roll called: Present - Aldermen Anderson, Graham, Hume, Linn, Morris, Phillips, Zeller - 7
Absent - Aldermen Keemann, Carleton, Glass, Jackson, Newton, Nitschke, North, Platt, Schneider, Schuber, Sutor, Townsend, Wingfield - 13
Alderman Morris moved a call of the Council, which was duly adopted.

Second roll call: Present - Aldermen Anderson, Keemann, Graham, Hume, Linn, Morris, Newton, Nitschke, North, Phillips, Schneider, Schuber, Zeller - 13
Absent - Aldermen Carleton, Glass, Jackson, Platt, Sutor, Townsend, Wingfield - 7
Alderman Linn moved to suspend the call, Carried.

The following call, and report of service of same were read:

Austin Texas May 19. 1891.

To the Hon. Board of Aldermen of the City of Austin.

Gentlemen: - I hereby call a special meeting of the city council of the city of Austin, to assemble in the Council chamber, at the city hall, at 5 o'clock p. m. this the 19th, day of May, 1891, for the purpose of further considering an ordinance now pending before the City Council to make an appropriation to defray the expenses of the small-pox camp, and also to consider the pending amendment thereto, and for the purpose of considering an ordinance to make an appropriation of \$1000. to pay for the printing and engraving of the water works and electric light bonds for the city.

An ordinance appropriating the sum of seven hundred dollars for the purpose of

maintaining a place for the care of persons affected with the small-pox, was taken up, it having been read a second time. Alderman Graham moved to amend section one of the same by inserting \$200. to pay R. S. Graves M.D., for assistance in treating and guaranteeing small-pox during the month of April 1891.

Alderman Linn moved as a substitute that name of R. S. Graves and the sum of \$200. be stricken out and that the name of W. S. Panten and the sum of \$50. be inserted.

Alderman Wingfield entered the council and answered to his name.

Alderman Morris moved that the substitute offered by Alderman Linn be divided and the motion prevailed by the following vote:

Yeas - Aldermen Anderson, Hermann, Graham, Humm, Morris, Newton, Nitschke, North, Schuber, Wingfield, Ziller. - 11.

Nays - Aldermen Linn, Phillips, Schneider - 3

The question having recurred upon the inserting of the name of W. S. Panten for that of R. S. Graves, the substitute was adopted by the following vote:

Yeas - Aldermen Anderson, Hermann, Graham, Humm, Linn, Morris, Newton, Nitschke, Phillips, Schneider, Schuber, Wingfield, Ziller - 13

Nays - Alderman North.

The question being upon the adoption of the substitute to strike out the sum of \$200. and insert in lieu thereof the sum of fifty dollars, the substitute was lost by the following vote:

Yeas - Aldermen Anderson, Hermann, Linn, Phillips, Schneider, - 5.

Nays - Aldermen Graham, Humm, Morris, Newton, Nitschke, North, Schuber, Wingfield, Ziller - 9.

The question recurring upon the adoption of the sum named in the amendment offered by Alderman Graham - \$200. - the same was carried by the following vote:

Yeas - Aldermen Graham, Humm, Morris, Newton, Nitschke, Schuber, Ziller, Mayor - 8

Nays - Aldermen Anderson, Hermann, Linn, North, Phillips, Schneider, Wingfield - 7

The caption and section one of the ordinance were changed to conform to the amendments, and it was then read a third time by caption, and an motion passed by the following vote:

Yeas - Aldermen Anderson, Hermann, Graham, Humm, Morris, Newton, Nitschke,

Nays Aldermen Levin, Phillips, Schneider - 3

An ordinance, appropriating the sum of one thousand two hundred and ten dollars for the purpose of paying for the engraving and printing of the future hundred (\$100) water works and electric light bonds for the city of Austin, was introduced and read the first time, after which a motion was made to suspend the rules and place the same on its second reading. The motion prevailed by a two thirds vote of the whole council, and the ordinance was read a second time by caption.

A motion was made to amend the caption and section one by striking out "\$100" and inserting "\$400". The motion prevailed, and a motion was then made to suspend the rules and place the same on its third reading, which was adopted by a vote of two thirds of the whole council.

The ordinance was again read by caption and on motion passed by the following vote:
Yeas - Aldermen Anderson, Allen, Lamm, Graham, Stume, Levin, Morris, Newton, Nitzecke, North, Phillips, Schneider, Schuber, Wainfield, Ziller - 14

The Council then adjourned
