

Called Meeting of the City Council of the City of Austin. January 9th 1882

W. A. Taylor Presiding

Roll call Present. Alderman Kinney Metz Schuler Radkey ~~Cook~~ ~~Huppertz~~ Moller Wilson Alderman Cook and Huppertz came in and answered to their names. absent Alderman Brueggerhoff and Moller

Alderman Cook moved a call of the Council motion Carried Present Aldermen Metz Kinney Cook Schuler Radkey Huppertz Platt and Wilson absent Alderman Brueggerhoff and Moller

Alderman Metz moved that the call of the house be suspended motion carried

Petition of A. H. Binkley Police officer was received and read asking that he be granted leave of absence for the space of six days Alderman Metz moved to refer the petition to City Marshal referred to City Marshal

His honor the Mayor offered the Official bond of J. W. Howard City Treasurer Alderman Platt moved the bond be accepted motion Carried

The Ordinance ordering and election for the purpose of extending the limit of the debt of the City was read the second time, Alderman Huppertz moved to suspend the rules and place the Ordinance on its third reading which was lost by the following vote Yeas Aldermen Kinney Cook Radkey Huppertz Nays Alderman Metz Schuler Platt and Wilson

Upon a question of the construction of the rule 6.

The President ruled that an ordinance on its second reading is open for amendment commitment or final passage upon this ruling Alderman Platt appealed from the decision of the chair

The chair was sustained by the following vote Yeas Metz Kinney Cook Schuler Radkey Huppertz and Wilson Nays Alderman Platt Absent Brueggerhoff Moller

The following resolution was offered by Alderman Platt
Be it resolved by the City Council of the City of Austin

That the maximum price for sprinkling the streets shall not be less than five hundred dollars and that the Mayor is instructed to state in his advertisement for bids that no bid

for less than five hundred dollars. will be entertained

Alderman Cook move to lay the resolution on the table Motion Carried

Alderman Kuppertz offered the following resolution which was adopted

whereas a great many complaints are made by many Citizens of Austin against the distribution of the various gas lamps and Water Hydrants throughout the City

Therefore be it resolved by the City Council of the City of Austin That the Mayor appoint special committee of three whose duty it shall be to investigate said matter and report to this Council at the next regular meeting thereof with such recommendations as they may decide advisable

This honor the Mayor appointed Aldermen Kuppertz Platt and Brueggerhoff. as a special committee of three to investigate matters referred to in the above resolutions

Alderman Kunny offered the following Ordinance which was adopted by the following vote Yeas Alderman Spinnery Cook Schuber Radkey Kuppertz and Wilson Nays Alderman Platt. Absent Alderman Brueggerhoff and Kruller.

Be it ordained by the City Council of the City of Austin That the sum of Forty six dollars and forty eight cents \$46.48 be and the same is hereby appropriated for the Commissions of the City Treasurer and Collector on Collections and assessments.

Alderman Metz moved to suspend the rules and now place the Ordinance on its second reading the rules were suspended and the ordinance passed by the following vote Yeas Alderman Metz Spinnery Cook Schuber Radkey Kuppertz and Wilson Nays Alderman Platt. Absent Alderman Brueggerhoff and Kruller.

The rules were further suspended and the Ordinance placed on its third reading and final passage and passed by the following vote Yeas Alderman Metz Spinnery Cook Schuber Radkey Kuppertz and Wilson Nays Alderman Platt absent Brueggerhoff and Kruller.

This honor the Mayor presented the nomination of R. J. Grant. as a police man Alderman Metz

moved that the nomination be confirmed Seconded
by Alderman Cook Lost.

On Motion of Alderman Platt the nomination
was referred to the Police Committee

On Motion the Council adjourned
