

Called Meeting of the City Council
Austin May 18th 1887
R Platt Acting Mayor Presiding

Roll call present. Aldermen. Kinney Cook Schubert
 Brueggerhoff, Radkey Morrell Platt Wilson Absent.
 Kelly & Kupschitz.

Alderman Morrell moved a call of the Council motion
 carried and the Marshal sent after absentees.

Call of the Council read, which was for the
 consideration of the right away of the Northwestern
 R R and the percentage of the ad valorem taxes for
 the year 1887 and for such other business as may be
 called to the attention of the Council

Minutes of the Called meeting of May 16th 1887
 was read and approved

Motion made to suspend the Call of the Council
 motion lost.

Ally fine returned against aldermen for non
 attendance at previous council meetings was remitted
 by order of the Council

Alderman Cook moved to suspend the Call of
 the Council motion carried

The committee to whom was referred the Ordinance
 granting the right away to the Austin and North
 western R Way. to the Capitol and university grounds
 asking that more time be extended to them that
 they were not ready to report request granted and the
 extension of time granted

The Ordinance fixing the percentage of Ad valorem
 Tax for the year 1887 was called up Alderman Morrell
 moved to lay the Ordinance on the Table Motion
 lost by the following vote Yeas Cook Brueggerhoff
 Morrell and Platt nays Kinney Schubert Radkey Wilson
 being a tie vote the Mayor voted nay.

The motion to indefinitely postpone the consideration of the Ordinance fixing the percentage of Tax for the year 1882 was tabled by the following vote Yeas: Kinney, Schuber, Radkey, Wilson, Mayr, Cook, Brueggerhoff, Noeller, and Platt being a tie vote the Mayor voted yeas.

Motion to adjourn lost by the following vote yeas: Brueggerhoff, Noeller and Platt, Nays Kinney, Cook, Schuber, Radkey and Wilson.

Alderman Brueggerhoff move a call of the Council motion carried.

Alderman Radkey moved to suspend the call of the council motion lost.

Alderman Platt moved to adjourn motion lost. On motion of Alderman Cook the Call of the Council was suspended. The following is the report of the committee to whom was referred the proposition of the H. T. & C. Rail Way, which was adopted.

Your committee to whom was referred the proposition of A. H. Swanson Gen Supt. of H. T. & C. Ry. Co. in reference to the bridge and grading Pine Street Pine Street bridge leave to report that we have had the same under consideration and advise that the proposition is not accepted.

We regard the proposition as very unfair and recommend that said Railway company be required to grade and level Pine street in accordance with the Ordinance granting them the right away.

Eighty five dollars and fifteen cents for approved account,
including expenses of Protection H. & Co. for Jan 1882,
which was read first time and read second and
third time under suspension of the rules and on
motion of Alderman Schuber passed by the following
Vote: Yeas Hinney Cook Schuber, Radkey Moeller Brueggerhoff,
Wilson

A fine of one dollar was entered against Aldermen
Nortz and Kupsurtz for non attendance at this meeting

On motion of Alderman Brueggerhoff the Council
adjourned.
