Roll call present aldermen Lawrence Schubert
Bruggierhoff Krollen Clark and Wilson

A Fine of one dollar was entered against
Aldermen Hitz Kinnery Radkey & Kuppertz
for nonattendance at this meeting

The minutes of Dec 15 1882 and Jan 7. 8. 5 & 6.
1883 were read and approved

Petition was received from H. Tilorred
asking that the Council grant to him
the right to erect a fruit stand on the corner
of lot 1, Block 7. Petition referred to the Fire
Committee

The following report was received from the
City Engineer which was adopted and the
Finance Committee instructed to report an ordinance
to the council to cover the amount asked for

To R Black chairman of the street committee
Dear Sir

After having made a thorough exam-
ination of the streets of Austin I would most
respectfully ask for an appropriation of one
thousand and seventy five (\$1075) dollars to
put the streets in a passable condition

\$250 seventh ward \$2000 eighth ward \$5000
Ninth ward \$1000 Tenth ward \$000 Total \$107500

report of the Cemetery Committee

Mr Riley proposes that if the City will fence and improve his lot across that he will give the City one half of the proceeds of the sale of lots Riley proposes to make title to purchase and turn over to the City half of the money.

The report was referred to the special committee on Cemetery and in motion the City attorney was added to the Committee

Alderman Gordon offered the following resolution which was adopted

Whereas the Contract for the City Printing has expired and a new contract has to be made for the next twelve months,

Therefore Be it Resolved by the City Council of the City of Austin That the Mayor be and is hereby instructed to advertise for bids and after receiving the latter he shall refer the same to the printing committee for further action and report to the City Council at the next ^{regular} meeting

Alderman Bruggershoff offered the following Resolution which was adopted

Resolved by the City Council of the City of Austin That the committee on Fire Department be and is hereby instructed to submit an ordinance at the next regular meeting regulating the construction repairs and regulations for awnings within the fire limits of the City of Austin.

Alderman Platt offered the following resolution which was adopted

Be it resolved by the City Council that the City Marshal and City attorney are hereby instructed to ascertain by what authority the various fruit stands have been erected on the

sidewalks of the City and report their action to the next meeting of this council

A petition was received and Read from J. Everett in regard to the accounts of Ed Creary for feeding the City Prisoners and City horses for the month of Dec 1882.

The petition was referred to the Finance committee

Alderman Brueggerhoff introduced an ordinance amending art 415 section 1 of the revised ordinance of the City of Austin the same being in regard to the appointment of police officers

The ordinance was read first time and then referred to the police committee

Alderman Clark introduced the following resolution

Be it resolved by the City Council of the City of Austin That the resolution passed Dec 28 1882 directing the City Treasurer to suspend the calling in of the 6% warrants till further order be and the same is hereby revoked

The resolution was amended by adding the words to take effect from the first day of March 1883

The resolution as amended was then adopted

Alderman Brueggerhoff offered the following resolution which was adopted

Be it Resolved by the City Council of the City of Austin That the ordinance committee be and are hereby instructed to submit an ordinance or an amendment to an ordinance in regard to the stock running at large within certain prescribed limits of the City By the next regular meeting

Alderman Brueggerhoff introduced the following Resolution which was adopted

Be it Resolved by the City Council of the City of Austin That the regular paid employees of the Fire Department shall be placed on the regular pay roll of the City and their respective

salary, be deducted from the appropriation for the support of the Fire Department

Alderman Morrell offered an ordinance authorizing the Mayor to purchase Horses Carts Harness &c to be used in repairing the streets of Austin. The ordinance was read first time and then referred to the Police Committee and the City Marshal.

Alderman Brueggerhoff introduced an Ordinance appropriating \$400.00 to pay J. K. R. Mr. Fall City Engineer for services rendered from March to Sept 1888 said amount having been deducted from the salary of Mr Fall during that time the ordinance was read first time and then went over to the next meeting

Alderman Plath offered the following resolution which was adopted.

Be it resolved by the City Council of the City of Austin That the Mayor is hereby requested to appoint a committee of three alderman in connection with the City attorney to report at the next regular meeting by ordinance or otherwise what is necessary for the better protection of Citizens from false measure of wood sold from Wagons on the streets of Austin His Honor the Mayor appointed as the Committee Alderman Plath Schubert & Wilson

Alderman Plath moved to excuse all aldermen for not attending former council meeting Alderman Brueggerhoff moved to lay the motion on the table motion to table carried by the following vote yea aldermen Lawrence Brueggerhoff and Morrell nays aldermen Schubert Plath and Wilson it being a tie vote the Mayor voted yea

On motion Alderman Morrell and Wilson were excused for not attending former council meeting and the fines imposed against them remitted on account of sickness and absence from the City

On the recommendation of Alderman Platt
 the Mayor nominated W^m Tyler as special police
 officer. The Mayor also nominated N^o Mr. Casier
 as a special police officer. The nominations
 were confirmed by acclamation.
 Read and approved Feb 7th 1883.
