Report of special committee to whom was referred
the petition of the City Water Company.

To the Hon. Mayor and City Council of the
City of Austin.

Your special committee to whom
was referred the petition of the City water Company
^{to have} to refund to them the taxes of 1884 paid by them
amounting to \$2000, beg leave to report that they have
had the same under consideration and find
under the present constitution of the state, there
is grave doubt as to the right of the petitioners
to have said taxes refunded or of the city to so refund
them but your committee also find that by section
eleven of said contract between the City and petitioners
the latter was to perform certain services, and
in consideration therefor was to be exempt from
taxation, while the exemption herein provided
for is perhaps not authorized, it is undeniable
that the company performed the services, and
is entitled to compensation; and your committee
think that the proper amount of taxation for
the year less the amount of school tax which
is not properly a municipal levy, and which
could not fairly be said, and come within the
terms of the contract entered into. Your committee
therefore recommend that the sum of \$1876⁶⁰ be
appropriated to pay the water company, for services
rendered for the year 1884 under section eleven of
said contract.

Alderman Trickie came in and answered to his name.

Alderman Odell called up an ordinance appropriating the sum of \$585.00. to refund taxes paid by L. E. Daniels. The ordinance was read second time, then laid over.

An Ordinance providing for an increase of the Police force to 20 men exclusive of the Marshal and Sergeant of Police, was called up and read second time, then laid over.

Alderman Underhill came in and answered to his name.

Alderman Brush introduced an Ordinance entitled "An Ordinance amending an Ordinance appropriating \$300. for improvement of Cedar and Cypress Street. The amendment provides that the unexpended balance of the appropriation shall be used for the general improvement of the streets in the 10th ward.

The ordinance was read second and third time under suspension of the rules and passed by the following vote: Aldermen Schneiders, Pillow, Hancock Wells, Campbell, Schubert, Underhill, Warren, Trickie, Odell, Carrington, Heile, Platt, Brush.

Alderman Trickie introduced the following resolution which was adopted.

Be it Resolved by the Councils, that a special committee of three be appointed to fully investigate the conduct of the special Detectives while in the employment of the City of Austin.

Be it further resolved that said special committee be further empowered to investigate the alleged outrages perpetrated upon the colored man, Jim Mack, by the said Detectives and City officials.

The mayor appointed as the committee Aldermen Trickie, Platt, and Schneiders.

The Finance committee introduced an Ordinance appropriating the sum of \$133⁷⁵ to pay approved accounts. The ordinance was read first time; the motion to suspend the rules and read the ordinance a second time was lost.

Alderman Hancock introduced an ordinance entitled: "An Ordinance appropriating the sum of \$1876⁵⁰. to pay the City Water company, for services rendered under section eleven of the contract between the City and said company." Read first time. The motion to suspend the rules and read the ordinance a second time was lost.

Alderman Hill submitted the following report of the Ordinance committee on the petition of G. P. Asmann.

Your committee on ordinances to whom was referred the petition of G. P. Asmann, for payment of damages would respectfully report, that they have had the same under consideration, and believing that the excavation complained of and by which petitioner was damaged, was not made or walled by the city or its authority and they recommend that the petition be not granted.
