A. S. Roberts. On motion, permission was granted to Capt. A. S. 3100\$ apd. roll. Alderman Wortham introduced an Ordinance appropriating the sum of \$3,100 for the purpose of paying officers and regular employes of the city for the month of April, 1889. It was read first time, after which motions were made to suspend the rules and place it on its second and third readings and that it do pass, all of which were adopted by the following vote:

Alderman Wortham also offered an Ordinance appropriating the sum of \$1673.36 for the purpose of paying approved accounts.

It was read the first time after which motions were made to suspend the rules and place it on its second and third

readings and that it do pass all of which were adopted by the following vote.

Alderman Platt presented an Ordinance appropriating \$400.00 to repair bridge over Waller Creek on East Fifth street. It was read first time after which motions were made to suspend the rules and place it on its second and third readings, both of which were adopted by a vote of two thirds of the Council and on motion the ordinance was passed.

Alderman Platt also offered an ordinance appropriating the sum of \$300.00 to repair Culvert on West Sixth Street. It was read first time after which a motion was made to place it on its second reading, which was lost - yea 13, nays, none.

Alderman Ziller was excused.

Alderman Wortham introduced a resolution authorizing the City Assessor and Collector to deliver to A. S. Walton tax receipts, for taxes due the City of Austin, on lots 7, 8 and 9, in said City for the years 1878, 1879, 1880, 1882, 1883 and 1884, aggregating \$231.05, the delivery being in accordance with a compromise of suit of A. S. Walton vs. the City Austin which was agreed to on the 11th day of July, 1887. The resolution was adopted.

Alderman Jones introduced An Ordinance amending Section three of an Ordinance Creating the office of Sanitary Inspector of the City of Austin, and prescribing the salary and duties of the office - passed

21st February 1887.

It was read the first time and on motion of Alderman Linn laid on the table subject to call.

<sup>500\$ polkman</sup> Alderman Jones also offered an Ordinance appropriating the sum of \$500.00 to pay Council for defending William B. Davis on charge of murder. It was read first time and motion of Alderman Wortham laid on the table subject to Call.

On the recommendation of the Mayor the fine and costs assessed in the recorder's Court against Fanny Brown were remitted. The Mayor laid before the Council a bill for three dollars against the City of Austin payable to Mrs. Johnson, the same being for pound fees collected from her on account of her cow having been in City pound. It was referred to the finance Committee with instructions to include it in the next general appropriation ordinance.
