

The minutes of a Called meeting of the City Council.

Austin, Texas, May 3, 1890.

Wm. John McDonald, Mayor presiding.

Roll Call - Present - Aldermen Assmann, Jackson, Jones, Martin, Mitschke, Phillips.

Call. Absent - Aldermen - Anderson, Boland, Carlsten, Graham, Hume, Linn, Metz, Newton, North, Platt, Schneider, - 11.

There being no quorum present a Call of the Council was ordered.

Aldermen Anderson, Carlsten, Linn, and North, entered the Council and the Call was suspended.

Call. The following Call was then read.

Notice having been received from the Judges of Election for the Seventh Ward of the appointment by them of C. D. Walker and J. B. Hutchison as Clerks or assistants, they were confirmed as such Clerks or assistants.

Alderman Schneider entered the Council and answered to his name.

John P. Kirk, was on motion, appointed Judge of Election for the Seventh Ward instead of W. W. Arken who would not accept the appointment as Judge of Election for said Ward.

On motion, the Council then adjourned.
