Gentlemen: I hereby call a special meeting of the City Council of the city of Austin, to assemble at the city hall this day at 4.30 P.M. for the purpose of ratifying and confirming the recommendations of the Board of Public Works in regard to awarding contract for constructing foundation of power house; also for the purpose of making an appropriation of \$14,000 for the purpose of paying for submerged and damaged lands, salaries of engineers, inspectors, secretary, and any other miscellaneous expenses connected with the construction of the Water and Light System for the city of Austin; and for the further purpose of acting on any other recommendations of the Board of Public Works that may be submitted to the City Council.

A resolution from the Board of Public Works was read, asking that an appropriation of \$10,000 be made for the payment of claims for submerged lands, engineering and miscellaneous expenses connected with the construction of the water and light system.

Alderman Anderson introduced an ordinance appropriating the sum of \$10,000 for the purpose of paying for submerged lands engineering and miscellaneous expenses connected with the construction of the water works and electric light system for the city of Austin.

It was read first time and a second and third time under suspension of the rules and passed by the following vote:

Hon Board of Public Works, Austin, Texas:

Gentlemen - I respectfully report that I have this day made a sale, subject to the ratification of the city council, of one hundred thousand dollars (\$100,000) additional of Austin waterworks and electric light bonds at ninety-two cents (92c) flat, fifty thousand dollars (\$50,000) of same for cash at once on delivery, and the other fifty thousand dollars (\$50,000) to be delivered within 60 days and paid for as delivered, and I ask that your make recommendations concerning the sale to the city council. Alderman North offered the following resolution:

A resolution confirming the sale of one hundred of the waterworks and electric bonds of the City of Austin of \$1000 each, and ordering their delivery.

Resolved, That the sale made by the mayor of one hundred of the waterworks and electric light bonds of the City of Austin of \$1000 each (the same being a portion of the bonds contemplated and provided for by an ordinance levying a tax of 91 cents on each \$100 worth of property for the year 1893, approved October 18, 1893) at the price of 92 cents flat on the dollar, be and the same is hereby confirmed, and the mayor is hereby instructed to deliver the same to the purchasers on their paying the purchase money into the city treasury.

The resolution was read the first time after which a motion was made to suspend the rules and place the same on its second reading, which was adopted by the following vote:
