

W. C. & H. W. City Council
Austin, Texas Nov. 12, 1871.

Mayor W. C. C. presiding. W. C. and J.
Present. Alderman Gray, H. G. Dell, Mason,
Sheehan, Strong, & Vaughan. W. C. was present.

The Mayor stated that he had called
the Council together for the purpose of suggesting
the propriety of employing law Special Police men
to act as detectives during the stay of the Circus
in the City on the 16th. inst. and to preserve the
peace on that day and night.

The following resolution was then introduced
Resolved by the City Council of the City of
Austin. That the City Marshal, he and he
is hereby authorized, by and with the consent
of the Mayor, to employ law efficient men to
act as Special Police men, from 8 O'clock A.M.
on Saturday the 16th until 8 O'clock A.M. on
Sunday the 17th inst. at a rate of compensation
not to exceed five dollars per day.

Resolution adopted.
Moved by Alderman Raper that the Annual
Report of the Mayor for the past fiscal
year and accompanying reports be pub-
lished in all the City Papers. Carried
Moved by Alderman Strong, that the Mayor
be authorized, to have 500 copies of his
report published in pamphlet form.

Motion lost.

The following resolution was presented by
Alderman Cason.

"Whereas it is represented, that several
parties are in possession of lots or parts of
lots in the City Cemetery, by the burial of
their friends on the same, who have not paid
for them.

Be it therefore resolved. That all
lots or parts of lots so held, if not paid for,
by those claiming them within sixty days,
shall be declared vacant and offered
for sale, and that the City Assessors and
Collector notify all persons who have their
friends buried on such lots or parts of
