Alderman Parr moved that two alder-
men and the City Engineer be appointed
as a committee to examine and supervise
said work. Motion carried and the Mayor
appointed Aldermen Parr & Sheehan as
such committee.

Resolutions adopted and ordered prin-
ted. Also certified copies ordered to be
forwarded to the Mayor of Memphis Tenn.
