August 10. 1878.

Mayor De Groot presiding. Roll called.  
~~Present~~ present Aldermen Crow, Crocker,  
 Platt, Carr, Sheehan, Strong and Vaughan.  
 Quorum present. The following business  
 was transacted.

The report of the meeting of citizens held on  
 Saturday last, as published in the Standard  
 of the 11<sup>th</sup> inst. was read and on motion  
 was adopted as a rule for the guidance of  
 the City Council and authorities.

The report of the City Engineer relative to  
 the bids for building a foot bridge over  
 Miller Creek on 1<sup>st</sup> River Street and for  
 curbing and paving on East Pecan St. was  
 referred to the Street Committee.

A resolution was adopted requesting all  
 citizens to report promptly to the City Mar-  
 shall any nuisance or violation of the  
 Sanitary ordinances coming within  
 their knowledge.

The Market House Committee submitted the  
 following report which was adopted.

To the Hon. Mayor and Board of Aldermen,  
 Your Committee to whom was referred the  
 petition of B. C. Mills relative to his con-  
 tract with the City in reference to the  
 city clock, respectfully recommend  
 that the City Clock be retained in its present  
 position and that the Mayor be authorized  
 to enter into a contract with B. C. Mills  
 to keep said clock in thorough repair  
 for one year for the sum of fifty dollars.
