

Called Meeting of City Council

February 9<sup>th</sup> 1848

Council called to order at 8.45 P.M.  
Mayor Dallman in the Chair.

Roll called and the following members  
answered.

Aldermen Brown, Crooker, Miller, Monkley,  
Metz, Nalle and Platt.

Absent, Aldermen Miller, Shahan and Strong  
Quorum present.

The Hon. Mayor stated to Council that he had called  
them together for the purpose of presenting to them  
for their action an Ordinance Regulating Markets,  
and to present his message Vetoing a Resolution or-  
dering the sale of a certain number of the Horses,  
Lands, and Harnesses, and also for the transaction of  
such other business as may be properly brought  
before them. He is known also stated that he had two  
other vetoes which he would present at the next  
regular meeting.

Honorable Board of Aldermen

City of Austin

Gentlemen

I have the honor to return here with a  
Resolution authorizing and directing the Mayor to have  
sold at public Auction all Lands, Horses, Mules, and  
Harness belonging to the City of Austin, except the one  
used for Sanitary purposes, passed by your Hon. Body  
Feb 4<sup>th</sup> 1848, with my objections hereto

Rule 5 of the Rules of Order of the City Council  
requires all resolutions of a general character to be  
read in Council on three several days unless two  
thirds of a full Board shall vote a suspension of the  
Rule.

This rule was not complied with, but the  
Resolution was only read once and passed, even if  
it had been passed in accordance with law,  
I do not think it judicious at this time, when  
money is scarce, to sell this property, and especially  
at public Auction, the City would realize but little

on a great deal of money expended.

If the Council desire to dispose of this property let it be done in a way by which the City would receive something near the value of what it offers for sale.

It could be made known through the public prints, that this property was for sale, and authority given the Mayor in conjunction with the Street Committee to receive bids, and when in their opinion a good offer was made, then to accept the same and sell.

dollars for the building of a bridge across Waller Creek  
on Cedar Street, which passed to second reading  
February 4<sup>th</sup> 1848 was taken up and read the second  
time

Alderman Mackley moved to amend the ordinance  
by striking out the word Twelve before the word hun-  
dred and insert the word six in place

The question was put shall the sum of twelve  
hundred be appropriated as called for in the first  
section of the ordinance

Alderman Hall moved to amend the ordinance so as to read as follows. That the sum of Seven hundred and fifty dollars or so much thereof as may be necessary be appropriated for the building of a Wooden Bridge

The Yeas and Nays ordered and the amendment of Alderman Hall passed by the following vote

Alderman Platt moved to strike out seven hundred and fifty and insert Twelve hundred and fifty. Motion withdrawn
