

Called Meeting of City Council
October 12th 1874

Council called to order at 7:50 O'clock P.M.
Mayor De Gress in the chair.

Roll called and the following members answered
Alderman Bremond. Doffenbaugh. James. Nease. Robinson
and Withers.

Absent. Alderman Cook. Laemour. Taylor and Ford.
Alderman James moved a call of the Council.
Call sustained and the Marshal was directed to bring
in the absentees.

Alderman ^{Taylor} came in, answered and took his seat.
On motion of Alderman Bremond the call of the
Council was suspended.

The Journals of the meetings of October 5th and 8th
(the last two meetings) were read.

On motion of Alderman Withers the Journal of
October 8th was amended by striking out the words
"Wilmyre Stone" and inserting the words "swedish Church"
in the resolution for the location of a street lamp at
that point.

On motion of Alderman Withers the Journal
of last meeting was amended by inserting the name
of H. H. Clark in place of A. Eans who was appointed
at that meeting as Judge of Election in Ward No. 4.

On motion of Alderman Withers the Journals
of the last two meetings as amended were
approved.

116 Alderman Robinson moved to reconsider
the vote by which the Ordinance was passed at last
meeting levying a tax of one per cent on the property
for paving the Alley in Block No. 69.

The Leas and Rays ordinance and the
motion to reconsider carried by the following vote:
Yeas Alderman Bremond Doffenbaugh James
Nease Robinson Taylor and Withers. Nays None.

116 Alderman Robinson moved to amend the
Ordinance levying a tax of one per cent by striking
out the words "one per cent" and inserting the words
"one sixty of one per cent."

The Leas and Rays ordered and the motion
to amend carried by the following vote:

Yeas Alderman Bremond. Doffenbaugh. James
Nease. Robinson. Taylor and Ford. Nays None.

The Ordinance as amended was read and passed to second reading.

Alderman Deffenbaugh moved to suspend the rules and put the Ordinance on its second reading.

The Yeas and Nays Ordered and the Motion to suspend the rules carried by the following vote:

Yeas. Aldermen Bremond, Deffenbaugh, James, Moas, Robinson, Taylor and Withers, Nays None.

The Ordinance was read the second time and passed to its third reading.

Alderman Robinson moved to further suspend the rules and put the Ordinance on its third reading.

Petition of James Davis a cripple asking permission to peddle without license

On motion of Alderman Bremond the petition was granted

J. P. Looie submitted a proposition to construct a bridge across Haller Creek on Macquish street for \$500 per cubic yard in City Harbors. The terms of payment to be one half the amount of cost of construction to be paid on completion and acceptance of the bridge and the balance in two equal payments at six and twelve months from date of acceptance of bridge

On motion of Alderman James the communication of Mr Looie was received

Communication from City Market Master was presented asking authority to have the inside of the City Market house whitewashed

On motion of Alderman Robinson the communication of the Market Master was received and the work ordered done under the superintendence of the Market Master

On motion of Alderman Taylor the Council adjourned
