

Called Meeting of City Council
October 5th 1877

Council called to order at 8.15 P.M.
Mayor DeGraes in the chair.

Roll called and the following Members an-
swered.

Alderman Bremond, Daffernbaugh, James
Robinson Taylor and Wilkes.

Absent Alderman Cook, Larmon, Snars
and Ward. George present

The Minutes of the last meeting (Oct 1st 1877)
was read

Alderman Taylor moved to amend the
minutes of last meeting on the question of per-
forming active on the Ordinance making an appro-
priation to build a bridge in Ward #18, so as to
read that the Mayor cast his vote in the negative
and the motion to postpone was lost. Carried

On Motion the Minutes of last meeting (Oct 1st)
as amended was approved

Alderman Robinson urged a call of the Council
Cull sustained, and the Marshal was directed
to bring in the absentees

On Motion of Alderman Robinson the call
of the Council was suspended

Petition of J. H. Erwin stating that in
February 1875 he contracted with the Fire Com-
mittee of the City Council to file the Fire Assess-
ment sum of \$75⁰⁰ in U.S. Currency, but he
received instead City Warrants which he was
compelled to deposit of ab. a discount. That he
now is indebted to the city in the sum of \$50⁰⁰
which the city collector demands the U.S. Currency in pay-
ment. He asks that the collector be authorized to re-
ceive city warrants in settlement of said debt.

Alderman Bremond moved that the petition
of Mr. Erwin be granted

Alderman Robinson moved to amend by autho-
rizing the City Officer and Collector to pay Mr. Erwin
fifty dollars in U.S. Currency for his City Warrants
for fifty dollars

The motion as amended was adopted
Petition of Oregon Bremond, stating that he is
the owner of the building known as Bremonds Bank

Situated on the corner of Pecan Street and the alley between Congress Avenue and Brozey Street
and asking permission to erect a stairway running
from the alley to the second ^{story} of said building

On motion of Alderman Mathews the petition was granted.

Petition of August Hilbacher stating that he is the owner of Lot #3 in Block #65 in the City of Austin, that the Board of Appraisers had assessed the Lot \$1000 - above the assessment of the other lots in said block, that the board of Appraisers had acknowledged the error in the assessment and asking that the Assessment be reduced \$1000 -

On motion of Alderman Robinson the petition was granted and the Mayor was authorized to make the corrections as petitioned for.

The City Attorney to whom was referred the resolution presented at last meeting declaring the Amendments to the City Charter unconstitutional null and void, presented a report on same citing various authorities and giving as his opinion that said amendments are ~~Constitutional~~ and in force and may be enforced by court authority

On motion of Alderman James the report of the City Attorney was received and adopted.

On motion of Alderman James the report of the City Attorney was ordered printed in the Statesman and Gazette.

Your special Committee to whom was referred the report of the City Engineer have the honor to report that they have carefully examined the same, and respectfully recommend that a tax of one cent be levied upon all the property fronting on either side of the Alley of Block 77-69 and that an Ordinance be passed authorizing the levy of said tax, also authorizing the Mayor to let the contract to the lowest and best bidder at a sum not to exceed 98 cents per square yard.

On motion of Alderman Brummond the report of the Committee was received and adopted by City Attorney. An Ordinance to levy a tax of one per cent for the purpose of paving the alley in Block #69. City of Austin

The Ordinance was read and passed to second reading

By Alderman Taylor. Be it resolved by the City Council of the City of Austin, That the Clerk of the City of Austin be authorized to purchase a copy of Barkley's Digest of Parliamentary rules for the benefit of the City Council

On motion of Alderman Taylor the resolution was passed Alderman Taylor moved that the Mayor be authorized to lease the property known as the Old Mill property so soon as the term expires by which J. S. Bondurant was to commence work under his lease for said property and that the lease be made on the same terms as the lease to said Bondurant to arrive

The Mayor nominated Oscar Lane as special police Officer and asked his confirmation

On motion of Alderman Taylor the nomination was confirmed

On motion of Alderman Brummond the Mayor was authorized to issue his proclamation for the City Election on the first Monday in November next for the election of city officers

reading at last meeting was taken up and read
the second time and passed to stand reading

Alderman Maas came in and answered
and took his seat

Alderman Daffernbaugh moved to suspend
the rules and put the Ordinance on its third reading

The Hays and Hayes ordered and the motion
to suspend the rules carried by the following vote

The Ordinance was read the third time

Alderman Robinson moved that the ordinance
be passed

The Seas and Mayo Ordinance and the Ordinance passed by the following vote

Seas Alderman Brummond, Cook, Duffenbaugh, L James, Garrison, Mass. Robinson Taylor and Brothers Mayo None

On Motion of Alderman Brummond the Street Committee was authorized to have an Iron Pipe laid or build a Culvert across Pecan Street where the Alley of Block #69 crosses said Street.

Alderman James moved that the Mayor be authorized to fill vacancies should any occur in the Judges or Clerks of the Election ordered, and to designate places for holding the Election. Should any of the places which have been selected be unsuitable or cannot be secured carried.

By Alderman Cook Be it Resolved by the City Council of the City of Austin, That the Street Committee be authorized and directed to erect a Lamp with Post on the corner of Guadalupe and Mesquite Streets. Carried

By Alderman Hutton Be it Resolved by the City Council of the City of Austin, That the Street Committee be authorized and directed to erect and maintain a Lamp post with Lamp at Wilmer Street in Ward #7. Carried
Oct 12

Petition of John T Miller asking that an Iron Loop be put on the top of the Cistern situated on the edge of 10th & Ave Street in front of the House occupied by Washington Star Co et al.

On Motion of Alderman Brummond the petition of J T Miller was referred to the Street Committee with power to act.

On Motion of Alderman Garrison the Street Committee was authorized and empowered to employ a Team and Plow to do certain work on Streets in Ward #6

On Motion of Alderman Cook the matter of doing certain work in Ward #10 was referred to the Street Committee and City Engineer with power to act.

On Motion of Alderman Duffenbaugh the Ordinance appropriating One thousand dollars to build a bridge in Ward #8 which provides its

first reading October 1st, 1849, was taken up
and read the second time

Alderman James moved to amend the ordinance
by inserting the word Stone before the word bridge
Carried

Alderman Bremond moved to ^{further} amend
the ordinance so as to read as follows

An Ordinance Appropriating the sum of One
thousand dollars out of any money not otherwise
appropriated to build a Stone bridge in Ward #8
Carried

The Ordinance as amended was read and
passed to third reading

Alderman Robinson moved to suspend the
rules and put the ordinance on its third reading

The Yeas and Nays ordered and the Motion
to suspend the rules carried by the following vote

Alderman Daffernayh moved that the ordinance
