July 21st 1874

Council called to order at 6.45 P.M. Mayor
De Gress in the Chair

Roll called and the following members
answered.

Aldermen Cook, James, Lammour, and Hard
Absent Aldermen Fremont, Duffenbangle, Mass
Robinson Taylor and Hittus. No Quorum

Alderman Hard moved a call of the Council
Call sustained and the Marshal was directed to bring
in the absentees

Aldermen Robinson Taylor and Duffenbangle, came
in and answered. Quorum present

The Journals of meetings of July 7th and 14th was
read and approved.

Petition of John D. Deloh, Don Wilson, Leander Brown
and 26 others Residents and Real Estate owners on
the East side of Congress Avenue and near the
Colorado River. Stating that they are informed
that the City government has or is about to lease
a portion of the River walk to a Company for the
purpose of establishing a Tannery, and believing that
such an establishment would be an injury to them
and their property. Respectfully request that the
ground be not leased for that purpose as it is sit-
uated in their immediate neighborhood

On motion of Alderman James the petition was

Alderman Cook moved that the petition be referred to a special committee of three for investigation and report. Carried

Alderman Cook, Ford and Lammour were appointed on the committee

On motion of Alderman Cook the committee were requested to consult with the City Physician and other Physicians as to the matter complained of by petitioners

Petition of Ellis Morrow and Daniel Grossman, asking to be appointed night scavengers and asking for the exclusive privilege of removing night soil, under such regulations, license &c. as may be prescribed by the city council

Alderman Taylor moved that the petition be received and referred to a special committee of three for investigation and report, Carried

Alderman Taylor, James and Meas were appointed on the committee

Gentlemen

In obedience to art 139 of the Ordinance of the City of Austin, I hereby respectfully submit to you the roll of Active Members of a Horse Company which is proposed to be organized in this City.

The hereto attached communication was read at the meeting of the Board of Fire Commissioners, on July 9th and after a careful examination into the character and capacity as firemen of the persons making the application, it was resolved unanimously to admit the applicants into the Austin Fire Department as a Horse Company
