The Mayor directed the marshal to bring in the absentees.

answered. Quorum found

Alderman Hard moved a call of the
house and that the absentees be brought in
full sustained

Whereupon the Marshal was dispatched for the absentees
the Journal of last meeting was read and
approved.

Alderman Robinson came in, answered and
took his seat.

On Motion of Alderman Ward the call of the
Council was suspended.

The Mayor presented the following message

... Mayor's Office Austin Texas

July 5th 1877

To the

Honorable Board of Aldermen City of Austin
Gentlemen

I have the honor to return herewith
An Ordinance fixing the Salary of the City Engineer
of the City of Austin with my objections thereto

The Ordinance seems to be inconsistent with it-
self, to be self-contradictory. Its first Section reduces the
Salary of the City Engineer from and after the first day
of August next, Its third section by providing that it take
effect from and after its passage, seems to reduce it about
a month in advance.

It is considered that an elective office holds and
takes his salary under a contract. Hence it is doubtful
whether it can deprive him of office without his
consent, be reduced, especially after it had been fixed at
a certain rate by the unanimous vote of the Council.

In any event it would be in better taste not to
attempt to reduce it during his temporary absence and
when he is afforded an opportunity to have a hearing as to
the matter so important to him.

after counting the votes announced that Mr. Hiles had received
5 Votes for confirmation and two against which confirmed
the appointment

Petition of John Bowdow stating that his contract
for Furnishing Oil Lighting Extinguishing and Keeping in
repair the Street Oil Lamps in the City had expired
and asking Council to renew his contract on the
same terms

On Motion of Alderman Brummond the petition
was referred to the Street Committee

Petition of Mr. Rayner A. Carington and
Mr. Shaw and 54 other citizens of Ward by asking
that a public well be dug out out Lot No 55 in
near Brady's Store.

On Motion of Alderman Brummond the petition
was referred to the Street Committee with power to act

The Mayor presented the names of Fred Rushman
John B. Jeff. Mr. Shelly. Mr. C. Carrington. John Dally
Mr. Bradley, James Simms, Mr. G. Burland. Mr. McElz.
C. S. Metz, Mr. Rhodius, William H. Hall. Mr. Green
J. H. Sherry, Mr. H. Dowry. and Joseph Shillcock and
asked Council to confirm them as special policemen

On Motion of Alderman ^{Ward} the nominations were
confirmed
