

Called Meeting of City Council
May 23rd 1877.

Council called to order at 12.15 o'clock Mayor Thaler
in the chair

Roll called and the following members answered
Aldermen Robinson and Taylor

Absent Aldermen Brimond Cook, Duffenbaugh
James Larmour Maas and Ward.

On Motion of Alderman Taylor the Marshal
was directed to bring in the Absentees

Aldermen Brimond, Duffenbaugh James, + Larmour
came in answered and took their seats.

Quorum present

The Mayor informed the Council that they
had been called together for the purpose of electing a
president of the Board of Aldermen vice Alderman
Chandler resigned and announced that nominations
were in order

Alderman Robinson nominated Alderman
Taylor

Alderman Taylor nominated Alderman
Robinson

On Motion of Alderman James the nominations
stood

The Mayor appointed Aldermen Duffenbaugh
and Cook as tellers and requested the members to
prepare their ballots.

After all the members had voted the tellers an-
nounced the following vote

Alderman Taylor received 4 votes and
Alderman Robinson received 3 votes

Alderman Taylor having received the highest
number of votes was declared elected President of
the Board of Aldermen

On Motion the Council adjourned
to meet as a Board of Officials

Council called to order at 3.30 P.M.
Mayor Wheeler in the chair: Roll called and the
following members answered

Alderman Deffenbaugh James and Maco
Absent Alderman Bromond Cook. Larimer
Robinson and Taylor

On Motion of Alderman James the Marshal
was directed to bring in the absentees

Alderman Bromond Larimer Robinson and Cook
Hend came in and answered Quorum present

Petition of J. J. Meadon, Manager of the
Raymond House. Asking that the City adopt
some plan whereby the waste water can be carried
from the Raymond House

On Motion of Alderman Maco the petition
was referred to Committee on Streets

Petition of Joseph Clay stating that on
the first day of March 1877 he took out license #1894
for carrying on the butcher's business and paid Twenty five
