

Regular Meeting of City Council
May 4th 1877

The Council was called to order at 4 o'clock P.M. Mayor Wheeler in the chair.

Roll called and the following members answered
Alderman Brundage, Cook, Buffington, James
Larimore, Haas, Robinson and Rock

Absent Alderman Taylor. Quorum present
By motion of Alderman Robinson the reading of
the Journal of previous meeting was suspended until
The returns of the Judges of Election for Alderman
in Ward No 5 was received, opened and read as
follows

At the undersigned Judges and Clerks of
an Election held in the 5th Ward of the City of Austin
on the 4th day of May 1877. In accordance with the
proclamation of the Mayor of Austin for one Alderman
for said Ward to fill the Vacancy of Jeff Chandler
do hereby certify that after the officers were duly
sworn there were cast Ninety votes of which
Robert H. Ward received 49 Votes
Andrew Neis received 41 Votes

appointed by the Mayor have affixed to the above named

Alderman Rock moved that as R. H. Ward had
received the highest number of votes that he be declared
elected Alderman of Ward No 5

C. B. C. Ward Alderman elected from Ward
5 being present the Mayor administered to him the oath
of office and he qualified and took his seat

Petition of S. H. Duff & R. H. Hunter for license
to sell spirituous, vinous and malt liquors in quantities
less than one quart in Ward 3. Granted

Petition of J. R. Rowland for some business in
Ward No 9 Granted

Petition of H O Kopp for same business in Ward 7th g
Granted

Petition of J. Griffith for same business in Ward 7th g
Granted

Petition of H A Taylor stating that on the 13th day of June 1875 Mr Scott Spear took out license for carrying on a meat market and paid the same for 6 months giving his note with petitioner as security for the remaining quarter of a year to amount \$250 that on the 1st day of November 1875 said Spear discontinued the business and has not since engaged in the same. No demand or notice of any kind has been given. And petitioner asks that said note be cancelled and remitted.

On Motion of Alderman Braxton the petition was referred to the Market House Committee with power to act.

Petition of H H Townsend asking that the Tax of assessment on certain property belonging to him be reduced to the amount that he rendered it for 1876.

On Motion of Alderman Braxton the petition was referred to the committee appointed sometime since for that purpose, with power to act. (The Mayor, Alderman Tiffenbaugh and James are the committee.)

Petition of Mrs Clara Spear asking that the assessment on Lot #7, Block #66 be reduced to \$1,000— for the year 1876.

On Motion of Alderman Braxton the petition was referred to same committee as Townsend's petition with same powers.

Petition of E G Don McEnglish and Robert English to grant them a lease of ground laying between Duraca and Guadalupe streets and south of Atiles street for manufacturing purposes for the term of twenty years.

On Motion of Alderman Braxton the petition was referred to Street Committee.

Communication from McEnglish on supply of pure water for the city of Austin.

On Motion of Alderman Ross the communication was laid on the table.

Petition of S Domingo, Morley, Bros. J Newman and others doing business on PecanSt ^{Rosy} St stating that they are greatly annoyed by draymen and asking for relief.

On Motion of Alderman Robinson the petition was referred to the City Marshal.

Petition of F D Moore for payment for
boarding one H J G Steamer and attendant for four
days amounting to \$20⁰⁰

On motion of Alderman Mass the petition was
laid on the table

By Alderman Diffentangh Whereas on the
25th day of January 1875 a petition was presented
to the City Council signed by 344 citizens and 10
prayers, praying for the erection of a wagon bridge,
across Waller Creek on Moseley street and that said
petition was referred to the Committee on Streets.

Therefore be it resolved by the City Council of the
City of Austin that the Mayor and Street Committee
be authorized to advertise for proposals for the building
of a rock bridge across said creek crossing

On motion of Alderman Cook the petition and
resolution was referred to the Street Committee

The Report of the City Marshal City Collector and
City Physician for the month of April was received

The Mayor called the attention of council to the claim
of the Sibley Manufg Co for balance of purchase money on Steam
Fire Engine and the Hutta Porcha & Rubber Manufg Co for the purchase
of Hose which was presented by the 1st Natl Bank to City Council on
the 2nd of April last and referred to Finance Committee.

He also informed council that the parties had been communicating
with, with reference to exchanging the city warrants held by them
for City Bonds.

Alderman Brereton moved that the Mayor and Finance
Committee be authorized to settle the claims referred to, to the best
interest of the City by Bonds or otherwise.

The Yeas and Nays ordered and the motion carried by
the following vote-

The Mayor informed the Council that a copy had been
served on him from Justice Hale concerning the case of Howard
etc vs City of Austin for work done on Bridge across Shabell
Creek on Cedar Street.

Alderman Brereton moved that the Mayor and
Street Committee be authorized to arrange the matter to the
best interest of the City

Council

By Alderman Cook. Be it resolved by the City
Council of the City of Austin that the Mayor and Street
Committee in connection with the Chief of Fire Department
be requested to determine how many Hydrants shall remain
on the Avenue and Pecan Streets and report to the City
Council

Carried

Alderman Brereton moved that the Market
House Committee be authorized to make such arrangements
with the City Water Company as they deem best
for supplying the City Market House with water, Services.

By Alderman Cook. Be it resolved by the
City Council of the City of Austin That all Horses and
Mules owned by the City be stabled at the different Fire
Companies, so in case of fire at night they can be used
to assist the fire department in conveying their Engines.
Trucks etc to all fires that may occur after 6 o'clock P.M.
And be it further resolved that said animals shall be

under the full control of the Chief of the Fire Department between the hours of 6 o'clock P.M. and 9 o'clock A.M. for him to designate which fire Companies shall have use of said horses and mules.

On motion of Alderman Braxton the resolution was laid on the table.

By Alderman Rock 18th it resolved by the City Council of the City of Austin. That the City Marshal has be and the same is hereby instructed to remove the signs in front and above Messrs Tobin Bros Drug Store on the north east corner of Congress Avenue and 10th Street said sign obstructing the sight towards the City Clock to the great detriment of Citizens living north of 10th Street.

Alderman Ward offered the following substitute for the resolution of Alderman Rock. That the City Attorney prepare an ordinance regulating the putting up of signs to Alderman Rock accepted the substitute.

Alderman Robinson moved that the substitute be adopted Carried

Alderman Braxton moved that the Board Committee be requested to ascertain if it would not be to the interest of the City to dispose of all City Horses Mules Carts &c except the Scavenger Cart and Horse Carriage.

112 By City Attorney. An Ordinance Fixing the license tax on Insurance Companies

The ordinance was read and passed to its second reading.

Alderman Cook moved that the rules be suspended and put the ordinance on its second reading.

The Year and Days ordered and the Motion to suspend the rules carried by the following vote

Hon Aldermen Braxton, Cook, Duffenbaugh, James, Harmon, Maas, Robinson, Rock and Ward

Nay 71 one

The ordinance was read the second time and passed to its third reading.

Alderman Robinson moved to further suspend the rules and put the ordinance on its third reading

Carried unanimously

The ordinance was read the third time and passed by the following vote

Hon Aldermen Braxton, Cook Duffenbaugh, James, Harmon, Maas, Robinson, Rock & Ward Nay 71 one

Alderman Ward was appointed on the Ordinance Committee
The Ordinance regulating Worked hours which passed
its first reading on the 13rd of April was taken up and read the
second time

Alderman Brereton moved that the ordinance be laid on the
table

The Year & Mayo ordered and the ordinance was laid on
the table by the following vote,

Nays Alderman Cook, Duffinbaugh and Larimore
Alderman Rock Alderman from ward 7th tendered his
resignation

On motion of Alderman Cook the resignation of Alderman
Rock was accepted

Mayor was instructed to issue his proclamation for
Election of Mayor of the City and to fill the vacancy caused
by the resignation of Alderman Rock in Ward No 7
and to appoint the necessary Judges and Clerks for
said Election and designate the voting places

On motion of Alderman Brereton the Cemetery
Committee was authorized to have the Cemetery fence
repaired

The Mayor stated that the City Officer had
nearly completed the assessment for the year 1877

and requested the Finance Committee to make an estimate of the amount required to defray the expenses of the City Government for the year and to establish the rate of taxation, he also requested the Ordinance Committee to prepare the ordinance required to levy the tax

On motion of Alderman Brumond the Council adjourned to Thursday May 10th 1877 at 3.30 P.M. to hear the reports of the Finance and ordinance Committees

Alderman Cook, Woffenbaugh, James Glass, Robinson, Taylor
and Ward

Absent Alderman Fremont and Larimore
Quorum present

Alderman Cook moved that the absentees be sent for
Carried

The Chairman directed the Marshal to bring in the
absentees

The Journal of April 2nd was read and adopted
On motion the further reading of the Journal was dispensed
with

Mayor Phelan came in and took the Chair and
called for the report of the Finance Committee on the
Tax of one cent for the year 1877

Alderman Taylor of the Finance Committee submitted
a report recommending the levying an advalorem
tax of $\frac{1}{4}$ of 1%

Alderman Glass of the Finance Committee submitted
a report recommending the levying an advalorem tax
of 1% for the year 1877

On motion of Alderman Cook the report was
received

Alderman Glass moved that an advalorem tax
of 1% be levied on all property made taxable by law
After considerable discussion action was postponed to
Tuesday, May 15th at 3.30.

As Alderman Oppen Bruggerhoff being present was in-
vited to a seat within the bar of the Council chamber

Petition of Charles Martin and Henry Raw for
the refunding of certain license tax paid by them to the
City of Austin, claiming that they had paid a
greater amount than allowed by law

On motion of Alderman Cook the petition was
referred to the Committee on Ordinances

Petition of Oppen Thaxter asking the issuance of
a duplicate warrant of City Warrant # 1128 for the
sum of Ten (10) dollars, the original warrant having been
lost, and to secure the City against loss, agreeing to give a
bond payable to the City of Austin in double the amount

of said book warrant

On Motion of Alderman Robinson the petition
was granted and the Mayor was authorized to issue
a duplicate warrant upon the petitioners failing the
bond as stated in petition.

On Motion of Alderman Robinson the Comm.
air adjourned to Tuesday ^{May 15th at 3 P.M.}
