The Yeas and Nays ordered and the motion to suspend the rules carried by the following vote

Yeas Aldermen Fremont, Cook, Duffenbaugh, James, Robinson, Rock and Taylor Nays None

The Ordinance was read the second time and passed to its third reading

Alderman Robinson moved to further suspend the rules and put the Ordinance on its third reading

The motion to further suspend the rules carried unanimously

Alderman Robinson moved that the salary of the City Physician be increased to Fifty dollars per month
