

Regular Meeting of City Council
April 2nd 1877

The Council was called to order at 8.45 P.M.
Mayor Wheeler in the chair

Roll called and the following members answered
Alderman Brummond, Cook, Duffusbaugh, Goodale James,
Larmour, Robinson, and Rush

Absent Aldermen Schuster and Taylor
Quorum present

The Organization of March 29th was read and
approved

Petitions & Communications

A communication from the Travis County
Medical Society on the Sanitary condition of Public
works

On motion of Alderman Robinson the communica-
tion was received

Alderman Taylor, came in... considered, received
and voted. His paper is in being, friends, by invitation of
Dr. J. H. Litterell, late member of the Travis
County Medical Society, being friends, by invitation of
numbers of the City Council, read a very lengthy and
carefully prepared report on the Sanitary condition of
several cities, showing the various modes of removing un-
healthy matter, explaining the faults of other apparatus
for employing Privy vaults and Caskets at any time
without offense, showing its advantages and benefits, and
presenting a clear and practical argument for the ne-
cessity of a proper and thorough sanitary system.

On motion of Alderman Taylor the paper presented
by Dr. Litterell was referred to a special Com-
mittee.

Alderman Taylor, Robinson and Larmour was ap-
pointed on the Committee

J. H. Manning and Mrs. Ludlow a Committee
to appointee by the Bridge Company, presented their
paper and J. H. Manning in behalf of the Committee
stated that the Bridge company were desirous of having
a public Fountain placed near the approach to the
bridge and that they were willing to bear entire
expenses connected with it and asked the Council
to order the erection of the fountain

On motion of Alderman Brummond the matter
was referred to the Water Committee with full power to act

Petition of J. S. Alexander stating that he had paid to the City Assessor and Collector the sum of \$79.50 in excess of what the law allowed for license for pursuing his occupation and asks that said amount be refunded him.

On Motion of Alderman James the petition was referred to the Committee on Finance with power to act.

Petition of Setal & Bros., Sutton & Wright, Joe Frank and other Butchers asking that an ordinance be passed closing all Markets between the hours of 12 o'clock midnight of every Saturday and 12 o'clock mid night of every Sunday night.

On motion of Alderman Goodale the petition was referred to the Committee on Market House with instructions to report next meeting.

Petition of Ernest Krohn, H. G. Suberk, E. P. Gregor and other butchers in the City Market, asking that a resolution be passed by the City Council to close the City Market House at 9.30 A.M. and to remain closed for the day.

On Motion of Alderman Cook the petition was referred to the Committee on Market House.

Petition of James Rollins asking to be paid the sum of Twenty-five dollars for damages to his truck caused by being precipitated down the bank of the approach to the bridge across Waller Creek.

On motion of Alderman Cook the petition was referred to the Committee on Streets for investigation and report.

Petition of Joseph Hale & Co asking that the sum of \$447⁵⁰ which he had paid the City Assessor and Collector for license which amount was in excess of what is required by law for doing business as a 4th Class merchant be refunded him.

On Motion of Alderman Robinson the petition was referred to the Special Committee appointed to investigate and act upon appointments (The Mayor, Buffetay & James).

Petition of Ph. Best asking that he be relieved from paying the tax assessed on the improvements on his property amounting to \$4⁰⁰ as said improvement was made in the months of July & March 1876 and not subject to taxation for that year.

Alderman Root moved that the petition and

all other petitions for release of taxes be referred to the committee appointed for that purpose with full power to act.

Petition of Ch. Starks stating that he was licensed to sell Spirituous liquors to Feb 25 1877 and that he is compelled to discontinue the business on the first day of April 1877 and asking he be only required to pay his license up to April 1st 1877

On motion of Alderman Robinson the petition was laid on the table

Petition of Julius Fyley for authority to establish a Bath House on the Colorado River at the foot of Oregon Street

On motion of Alderman Cook the petition was rejected

Petition of Charles Blake for authority to establish a Bath House on the Colorado River at the foot of Colorado Street

On motion of Alderman Cook the petition was referred to the Committee on Streets with power to act

Petition of J H Dwyer asking that he be allowed a credit on his taxes for the year 1876 for certain work done and paid for by him on the streets approaching his Ferry

On motion of Alderman Taylor the petition was laid on the Table

Petition of Charles I Evans, asking to be allowed the sum of Twenty five dollars for expenses in certain cases in the District Court against the City of Austin which he incurred in defending

On motion of Alderman Grammer the petition was granted and the Mayor authorized to draw his warrant on the City Treasurer for payment of the same

Petition of Emily Mandell asking to be paid the sum of Fifteen dollars for Boarding and Nursing Mrs Houston an old woman that was injured by being run over by a horse on the street

On motion of Alderman Robinson the account was ordered paid and the Mayor authorized to draw his warrant on the City Treasurer for the sum of fifteen dollars for the same

Communication from the First National Bank stating that they held City Warrants No 638 and 639 for \$1500 each that Warrant #638 for \$1500 and interest on both are now due, amounting in all to \$1650 and

asking that the same be paid.

On motion of Alderman Rost the communication was referred to the Committee on Finance with power to act.

Petition of James McCullough, J. H., Banker, John Kirkpatrick and others asking the ordinance prohibiting Licensed Vehicles used in the transportation of Merchandise from standing in certain places be repealed.

On motion of Alderman Idowale the petition was laid on the table.
