Council called to order at 3:40 P. M. Ald Mayor Huber in the chair. Roll called and the following Members answered. Aldermen Bromond, Hook, Duffenbush, Goodale, James, Larmon, Robinson, and Root. Absent Alderman Chandler  
Quorum secured

The Mayor informed the Council that he had called them together for the purpose of hearing the report of the Fire Committee to whom was referred the petition of the City Water Company for the erection and location of an additional number of Fire Hydrants and drinking fountains and extension of the time for the building of the

reservoir. Also to hear the report of the special Committee to whom was referred the petition of the proprietor of the Capital Theater for a permit to sell Spontaneous liquors in the Hall where the Variety Theater is exhibited.

On Motion of Alderman Rock the adjournment was sent for

On Motion of Alderman Duffenbaugh Alderman Taylor was excused from attendance

On Motion of Alderman Cook & Alderman Shuts was invited to a seat within the bar of the Council Chamber
