

Called Meeting of City Council

Council Chamber September 18th 1876

The Council was called to order at 5 O'clock P.M. Mayor Wheeler in the Chair

Roll called and the following Members answered
Alderman Bremond, Chandler, Cook, Duffenbaugh, Goodale,
James and Larmour. Absent Aldermen Robinson,
Shurtz and Taylor. Quorum Present

The Mayor informed the Council that they had
been called together for the purpose of taking further
action on Ordinance #86 which passed to its second
reading at the last meeting (Sept 9th)

The Ordinance was then read the second time and
passed to its third reading by the following vote

the City Council of the City of Austin, That the Contract
between John Gordon and the City of Austin for Lighting,
Extinguishing and Repairing in repair the Public Street Oil
Lamps be cancelled, and that said Contract be continued
no longer than the last day of the present month September 1876
II That the City Marshal is hereby instructed to take
charge of all Oil Lamps, Burners, and Fixtures which belong
to the City of Austin and have the same stored in

some suitable place until such time as they may be required for use.

Called Meeting of City Council

Council Chamber Sept. 29. 1876

The Council was called to order at 12:40 PM Mayor Wheeler in the Chair. Roll called and the following members answered. Aldermen Bremond, Chandler, Cook, Doffenbaugh, Goodale, James, and Shuck. Absent Aldermen Larmour, Robinson, and Taylor. Quorum present.

The Mayor informed the Council that he had called them together at the request of J. J. Brown, the lessee of the old Mill property. Mr. Brown being present stated that he desired the Council to grant him further time to comply with the terms of his lease, that he had every assurance of success in completing the mill and supplying it with all necessary machinery if the Council would extend the time to June next.

Alderman Shuck introduced the following resolution. That it be resolved by the City Council of the City of Austin, That the time for complying with the terms of the contract made with J. J. Brown on the 18th day of February 1875 for the construction of a Cotton and Woollen Mill be extended until the first day of June 1877.
