

Regular Meeting of City Council  
Austin Texas August 4<sup>th</sup> 1876

Council called to order at 4:30 P.M. Mr. H. Chandler  
President of the Board of Alderman in the Chair

Role called and the following members answered  
Alderman Brummett, Cook, Buffenbaugh, Goodale, James, Lamour  
Robinson and Taylor      Absent Alderman Shanks

Journal of July 10<sup>th</sup> and 13<sup>th</sup> read and adopted

Petition of John Richardson stating that she afformed  
for taxes on his property had been raised from \$100. to \$170.  
and asking that the property be placed at the assessment price  
named by him.

On motion of Alderman Robinson the Petition was laid  
on the Table

Petition of Dave Elliott, J. A. Ryall and others asking that  
a bridge be erected across Waller Creek at the crossing of  
Mulberry St. between Red River and Babine Streets

On motion of Alderman Cook the Petition was referred  
to the Street Committee

Petition of Grant and Walker stating that they  
propose to publish and issue a Full and Complete Directory  
of the City of Austin, and asking the City of Austin to  
subscribe for One hundred Copies of the work, at a price  
not to exceed Five dollars per Copy

On motion of Alderman Taylor the Petition was  
referred to the Committee on Printing

Petition of Ellen Johnson stating that she had issued  
to her City Warrant No. 395 on the City Treasurer for  
the sum of Fifteen dollars, and that the said warrant has  
been lost, and asking that a duplicate warrant be issued  
to her

Alderman Cook moved that she may or be autho-  
rized to draw his warrant on the City Treasurer for  
the sum of Fifteen dollars in favor of Ellen Johnson on  
condition that the said Ellen Johnson gives a good and  
sufficient bond payable to the City of Austin to secure the said

Alderman Diamond moved that a Special Committee of three be appointed, and that the report of the City Treasurer, City Assessor and City Clerk be referred to said Committee

The President of Council Alderman Diamond Shultz and Tiffenbaugh as the special Committee

Account in favor of Mrs E A. Hicks for \$6.00 for clothing destroyed at small fire suffered by order of city authorities

On motion of Alderman Tiffenbaugh the account was referred to the City Marshal and Receiver with power to make a settlement

Accounts of J D Moore for \$0.00 and G Kingberry for \$49.50 for Boarding Texas Veterans was presented for approval

On motion of Alderman James the accounts of Mrs Alderman Diamond, George Farmer, Robinson Taylor, Mrs Alderman Diamond being approved  
Moore and Kingberry was laid on the Table by the following vote,

Petition of Mrs Mary Payne asking permission to repair wooden building with shingles said building being situated in the fire limits

On motion of Alderman James the Petition was laid on the Table

Account of Eli Green for services as cart driver of eight days amounting to \$9.66

On motion of Alderman Diamond the account was ordered paid and the necessary amount appropriated for additional expenses of the Month of July 1876

By Alderman Tiffenbaugh Be it Resolved by the City Council of the City of Austin that Twenty five dollars or so much thereof as may be necessary is hereby appropriated out of any money in the Treasury, not otherwise appropriated for the purpose of purchasing Wind shades for the Council Chamber and the several Offices. And Twenty five dollars for desk for City Clerk Carried

By Alderman Tiffenbaugh Be it resolved by the City Council of the City of Austin that the sum of fifty

dollars, or so much thereof as may be necessary be and the same is hereby appropriated out of any money in the Treasury not otherwise appropriated for the purpose of purchasing Balls, Chain and Shackles for the use of the City in working prisoners on the Streets. That the City Marshal is hereby authorized to purchase the same, which purchase shall be approved by the Mayor.

Carried

By Alderman Taylor. Whereas the Merchants of this city have paid two quarters of this year (more or less) one per cent license tax under the ordinances of the City, calculated to be one fourth of one per cent license, and three fourths of one per cent of the Ad. valorem tax, upon their Merchandise and whereas they have been re-assessed for an ad. valorem tax of one per cent for the year 1876 it would be not more than just to refund the three fourths of one per cent already paid by them for this year.

Therefore Be it resolved by the City Council of the City of Austin that the Mayor be and he is hereby authorized and instructed to refund to each Merchant the three fourths of one per cent already paid by him or them, by issuing a city warrant to the parties so entitled to that amount.

By Alderman Robinson Be it Resolved by the City Council of the City of Austin that the sum of Two hundred and fifty dollars be and the same is hereby appropriated for the payment of Messrs Duffenbaugh and James for services rendered as a Board of Appraisers for the City of Austin

The Seas and Days ordered and the resolution passed by the following vote

Yea Aldermen Edmund Cook, Goodale, Larson  
Robinson and Taylor. Aldermen Duffenbaugh and James  
was excused from Voting. Nays None

Alderman Cook presented the following

Austin Texas August 7<sup>th</sup> 1876  
To his Honor the Mayor and City Council

Whereas it has come to the knowledge of several  
members of this Council, that there are several drinking  
and gambling houses in the 1<sup>st</sup> Ward Violating an Ordinance  
of this City which requires all such houses to close at 12  
o'clock midnight. Therefore be it resolved that the City  
Marshal see that all houses of this character promptly close  
at that hour and it shall not be so construed that  
when the front doors of said houses are closed that the

above ordinance is complied with, when the rear and intended meaning of the ordinance is that the rear doors shall be closed also, and it is emphatically the wish and desire of this City Council that this ordinance be strictly enforced. Carried

Alderman Book moves the following  
So be it moved the Mayor and City Council  
Whereas the fact is known and generally believed that  
there are certain officers under the pay of this City that  
are in the habit of violating certain ordinances

Therefore be it resolved that the Police Committee  
are respectfully asked to make a thorough and complete  
investigation of all such violators and report as soon as  
practicable to the City Council. Carried

The City Marshal presents charges against Police  
Officer J W Lane

On Motion the matter was referred to Police Committee  
by Alderman Taylor Resolved by the City Council  
of the City of Austin that no more expenses or burial expenses  
be allowed except the party so acting shall state under  
oath their inability to defray such expenses. Carried
