

Regular meeting of the City Council  
Austin, Tex.  
February 3<sup>rd</sup> 1873

His Hon. J. B. Wheeler in the chair called the Council to order, the roll being called the following named Aldermen answered to their names to wit:

Petition of H. P. Jensen praying for the privilege to retail liquors in quantities less than one quart was read and granted.

Petition of A. G. Bradbury for the privilege to retail liquors in quantities less than one quart, was read and granted.

Petition of Mechell Brothers, praying to re-  
tail liquors in quantities less than one quart  
was read, and granted.

Petition of J. J. & H. H. Tobin praying for the  
privilege to erect a stairway on the South side  
of the filler building on Main Street, was  
read and referred to Street Committee to make  
report at the next meeting.

Petition of B. McSherry, Ben Walker and many  
other tax-payers of this city, praying for the  
purchase of a Steam Fire Engine for the Colorado  
Fire Company No. 2, was read received, and  
referred to his Honor the Mayor.

Petition of C. M. Rose, praying for a balance  
pay of 18<sup>00</sup> for services as mounted police for  
the month of January 1873, was read, and referred  
to Police Committee to report at next meeting.

Petition of C. H. Louis & Co. Haigler praying  
for a renewal of their butcher privilege in Ward 2  
for the ensuing year was read, and referred to  
Market House Committee.

Petition of J. D. Macchison praying for a license  
privilege by the year, proposes to pay \$300<sup>00</sup> for  
such privilege, for exhibitions only to be carried

on motion the new Opera House was read received, and referred to Finance Committee. Petition of Henry Williams, "Brody Waller and many other citizens of the Ward, praying for the erection of a public Well in the main Street of Wheatsville was read, received, and referred to Street Committee.

The above named parties were appointed by His Hon. J. B. Wheeler and on motion of Ald. Robinson the appointments were confirmed.

The report of Alex. Evans for the month of January 1874, was presented, on motion of Ald. Brueggerhoff action on same was postponed until the regulating meeting.

Special committee which was appointed to draft a general license ordinance, reported, introduced, and recommended the passage of an ordinance <sup>(P.A. 2)</sup> entitled; - An Ordinance to regulate Licenses, Report, and ordinance received. The Ordinance read in whole, the Ordinance was then read by sections, and each section adopted separately after the adoption of the ordinance, the rules were on motion of Ald. Dohme suspended, the ordinance read the second time, on motion of Ald. Bremond the rules were further suspended, the ordinance read the third time. The yeas, and nays being called the ordinance passed by the following vote:

Special committee which was appointed to draft an ordinance fixing the ad valorem tax for the year 1874. Reported, introduced, and recommended the passage of an ordinance <sup>(P.A. 2)</sup> to be entitled; - An Ordinance regulating the amount of ad valorem tax to be imposed upon real and personal property in the City of Austin, and fixing a poll tax for the year 1874. report, and ordinance received. The Ordinance was read, on motion of Ald. Brueggerhoff the rules were suspended the Ordinance read the second time, on motion of Ald. Robinson the rules were further suspended the Ordinance read the third time, the yeas, and nays being called the Ordinance passed by the following vote: Yeas, Ald. Bremond, Boardman Brueggerhoff, Christian, Dohme, Metz, Mitchell, Robinson, Shantz, Todd.

Ald. Bremond introduced an ordinance <sup>(P.A. 3)</sup> to be entitled; - An Ordinance regulating the renting of Market Stalls and Market privileges for

the ensuing year. The Ordinance was received and read. On motion of Ald. Boardman the rules were suspended, the Ordinance read the second time, on motion of Ald. Bremond the rules were further suspended, the ordinance read the third time; the yeas, and nays being called the Ordinance passed by the following vote: Yeas: Ald. Bremond, Boardman, Brueggerhoff, Christian, Dohme, Metz, Mitchell, Robinson, Sholy, Todd. Police Committee who had under consideration an ordinance C H<sup>o</sup>(4) entitled: "An Ordinance relative to police, and police regulations introduced the same and recommended its passage. The Ordinance was received and read. On motion of Ald. Boardman the rules were suspended, the ordinance read the second time, on motion of Ald. Bremond the rules were further suspended the ordinance read the third time. The yeas, and nays being called the Ordinance passed by the following vote: Yeas: Ald. Bremond, Boardman, Brueggerhoff, Christian, Dohme - Metz, Mitchell, Robinson, Sholy, Todd, Police Committee who had under consideration an ordinance C H<sup>o</sup>(5) to be entitled: An Ordinance regulating the duties and prescribing the fee of City Marshall, introduced the same and recommended its passage, the ordinance was received and read, On motion of Ald. Metz, the rules were suspended, the ordinance read the second time, On motion of Ald. Boardman the rules were further suspended, the ordinance read third time, The yeas, and nays were being called the ordinance passed by the following vote: Yeas: Ald. Bremond, Boardman, Brueggerhoff, Dohme, Metz, Mitchell, Robinson, Sholy, Todd. (Ald Christian being absent.) Ald. Brueggerhoff offered the following Resolution: which was adopted, to wit:

Be it resolved that all Bills for payment of the City Police shall be indorsed by not less than

than a majority of the Police Committee and approved by them before any warrant shall be issued by them.

Ald. Brueggerhoff offered the following Resolution, which was adopted, to wit:

Be it resolved, that all taxes and dues to the City of Austin may be paid in City Warrants, except such dues as are otherwise provided for by ordinance; and that the resolution providing for the payment of taxes and dues, one half in U.S. currency is hereby repealed.

Ald. Boardman introduced the following Resolution, which was adopted, to wit:

Be it resolved, that this Honor be instructed to make proposals, to receive bids, for the purpose of filling in the stone bridge now erected on ravine at the crossing of Ash and Nees Streets and to open, drain, and grade Ash Street from said bridge to Guadalupe Street.

Ald. Brueggerhoff offered the following Resolution, to wit:

Be it resolved by the City Council of the City of Austin, That the City Marshal is hereby authorized and required to take possession of the City Cemetery and place Mr. G. L. Nitshke the City Sexton elect in possession of the same. Any person interfering shall be arrested and be tried for misdemeanor, and be fined as in other cases of misdemeanor.

On motion of Ald. Boardman the yeas and nays were called out the adoption of the resolution resulting as follows: Yeas: Ald. Brueggerhoff, Dohme, Okey, Scoville, Todd. Nays: Ald. Bremond Boardman, Mitchell, Robinson, (Ald Christian being absent.)

An Ordinance was introduced, entitled, An Ordinance to provide for the construction of Water Works in the City of Austin Texas. The ordinance was read.

On motion the ordinance was referred to a special committee of four, Ald. Robinson, Bremond, Mitchell and Brueggerhoff. On motion this Hon. B. Wheeler was added to the committee.

On motion the Council adjourned
