His Hon. J. B. Wheeler in the chair called the Council to order; the roll being called the following named ^{Aldermen} answered to their names: G. Boardman, W. B. Brueggerhoff, J. H. Robinson, Ed. Scholz, W. B. Mitchell, L. H. Todd.
Absent: Ald. Ed. Christian and F. Dobson.

His Hon. the Mayor stated that the meeting was called in the matter of Alex. Cans the contestant for the office of City Sexton and for various other purposes.

Whereupon Ald. Bremond moved that the Council go into executive session to investigate the election of City Sexton. Carried.

Petitions signed by many citizens praying to retain Alex. Cans as City Sexton were read, whereupon Ald. Brueggerhoff offered the following resolution, which was adopted:

Be it resolved by the City Council of the City of Austin: That in the contest to the Office of City Sexton between Alex Evans and C. F. Nitschke further action be postponed until the next regular meeting. Carried.

Ald. Bremond moved that the Mayor be authorized to state to the Agent of Mills & Smith: That if they will make up a statement of their account by the first day of January 1874, and will forward it to their Agent here to be delivered to the Mayor. That the Council will give said Mills & Smith ten year Bonds at 75¢ on the dollar, interest payable semi-annually in New York City at the office of Swenson Perkins & Co. Carried.

Ald. Bremond moved that the Mayor be authorized to have the Mayors Court Room partitioned off in rooms and comfortably arranged for the different City Officers. Carried.

Market House Committee to whom was referred the petition of Budington & Luxinger: reported favorable on said petition, no action was taken.

Ald. Bremond moved that the Street Committee be authorized to have a culvert built on Red River Street, between Bls. 43 & 44. Carried.

Ald. Brueggerhoff moved that the City Marshal be instructed to confer with the Agent of the Houston & Tex. Central R. R. Co. in regard to putting up lamps on the passenger, depot. Carried.

On motion of Ald. Brueggerhoff the Council adjourned to their regular monthly meeting
