read, and on motion of Ald. Sneed was referred to
Finance Committee.

Petition of J. Pollard Harrison asking for an Alley
way through Block No 68 in Division "C" of the city
of Austin was read. On motion of Ald. Brueggerhoff
it was referred to Committee on Streets.

Petition of J. Hallam asking privilege to retail spirit-
uous liquors, which on motion was granted.

Bill of M. L. Robertson against the city amt.
of three dollars for keeping blind woman Cbe. was
presented. On motion of Ald. Brueggerhoff the Mar-
shal was authorized to pay the same out of Fines.

Petition of J. B. Shepherd making application for
city Physician was read, whereupon Ald. Sneed
moved that a special Committee of three be appoin-
ted to take in consideration the propriety of
employing a regular city Physician. ^{of which members were} His Honor
the Mayor, appointed on that Committee Ald.
Sneed Hanning and Robinson.

The Resolution to allow the Recorder a clerk was taken up, and read, whereupon motion of Ald. Brueggerhoff the rules were suspended and after passing its second and third reading the yeas and nays were then called and passed by the following vote.

The Ordinance appropriating the sum of three hundred and fifty dollars to cover the judgment now pending in the District Court of Steward & Fitch vs. J. W. Glenn and W. C. Evans which was vetoed by his Honor J. B. Wheeler was taken up for action, whereupon Ald. Brueggerhoff moved a postponement until the next regular meeting, which motion passed unanimously.

Ald. Sneed moved that J. W. Glenn and W. C. Evans be informed to be present at that meeting, and the Mayor and Aldermen be requested to write every one concerned in this matter, which motion was unanimously carried.

The Ordinance introduced by Ald. Sneed allowing butchers to vent meat in different parts of town by paying the minimum price fixed on stalls in the Market House was taken up, but no action.

Ald. Sneed offered the following resolution: Be it resolved by the city Council of the city of Austin, That the minimum price of stalls in the city Markethouse be fixed at One Hundred and Fifty Dollars per annum, and that hereafter any licensed butcher in the City shall have the right to deliver fresh meat to his customers at any house or place within the City; and that hereafter any vendor of Vegetables within the City shall have the right without license to deliver vegetables to their customers at any hour after eight o'clock A. M. and at any place in the City. On motion of Ald. Sneed

the rules were suspended, the resolution passed to its second and third reading, the yeas, and nays being then called it passed by the following vote.

His Honor the Mayor announced to the Council that the meeting was called for the purpose to take in consideration the propriety of renting the City Market Hall for a number of years to Mr. F. Dohme.

Whereupon Ald. Brueggnerhoff offered the following Resolution. Be it Resolved by the City Council of the City of Austin That the City Market Hall be leased to Mr. F. Dohme for the term of two years at Three hundred Dollars in coin per annum, payable in ^{quarterly} advance, and give the security usually required. Which resolution passed unanimously.

Ald. Hanning moved to amend lines (5) and (6) in the resolution providing for election of a Chief of the Fire Department, to make it read thus: appoint one member from each of the organized fire companies who shall act as judge at said election. On motion the rules were suspended the resolution passed its second and third reading and after the yeas and nays were called it passed by the following vote:
