Call Meeting of the Board of Aldermen.

A Petition from the proprietors of Hacks in the City of Austin, was read, and on motion of Alderman W. Brueggerhoff, the following Ordinance was ordained:

Be it ordained by the City Council of the City of Austin, that in section

First of an ordinance passed by the City Council Nov. 6th 1870, regulating Hack Hire & the words, Twenty Five be stricken out and the words, Fifty be inserted and in section

Second of the same ordinance the words, and Fifty cents be inserted between the words, Dollar and fee also in the same section, the words, One Dollar and Fifty cents be stricken out and the words, Two Dollars be inserted; and on motion of Alderman

Robinson, the rules were suspended, and the ordinance passed the second and third reading and was finally adopted by the following votes:

Alderman G. Messina offered the following Resolution:

Resolved That the Theatre Company (the Miss Wren) be allowed to remove from the City Market Hall, the Stage, Curtains, and what ever may be their property, and deliver said Hall to the City Authority, clean and in good condition, that they are allowed the use of the chairs, belonging to the City in said Hall, and to return them to the City Authorities, again at the will of the

city council.

On motion of Alderman W^m Bruggenhoff the
following Ordinance was ordained.

Be it ordained by the City Council of the
City of Austin.

First That no person shall be allowed to keep in
the public streets within the City limits a stand
for Lottery or Gift Enterprise.

Second That after due notice to parties any person
convicted for violating this Ordinance shall be
guilty of misdemeanor and shall be fined
the sum of not less than three nor more than
one hundred Dollars.

Third That this Ordinance shall take effect and be
in force from and after its passage.

On motion of Alderman W^m Bruggenhoff
the rules were suspended and the Ordinance
was read the second and third time and on
motion of Alderman J. H. Robinson the Ordinance
was passed by the following vote.
