Ordinance was Ordained

Be it Ordained by the
 City Council of the City of Austin a. 1st that
 the fire limits of the City of Austin be extended so
 as to include all lots contained in the blocks fronting
 on Congress Avenue from the Capitol square to
 the Colorado River. That this Ordinance take effect
 and be in force from and after its passage.

On Motion of Alderman Robinson the rules were
 suspended and the Ordinance was read for its second
 and third time and was adopted by vote

On motion of Alderman Mussina the following Ordinance was ordained

Be it ordained by the City Council of the City of Austin

1st That no person shall keep in store or stored Kerosene Oil or any other oil or compound which is Explosive More than fifty gallons. ~~and~~ ^{and} ~~more~~ ^{more} than twenty five pounds of gun powder within the City limits except that such articles may be stored in a house to be fire proof and not connected with any other house said house to be approved as such by the fire Committee

2nd That hereafter no person shall keep for sale or store within the limits of the City of Austin Hay fodder straw shocks or long forage of any description in excess of five hundred pounds unless the same be pressed & securely bound by iron ties or wire in bales of not more than four hundred pounds weight to each bale

3rd That whoever shall be guilty of a violation of any part of the foregoing sections of this Ordinance shall be deemed guilty of a Misdemeanor and shall be fined not less than twenty five nor more than one hundred dollars

4th That this ordinance take effect and be in force from and after its passage.

On Motion of Alderman Brueggelhoff the rules were suspended and the Ordinance was read for the second and third time and on Motion of Alderman Bucaas was finally adopted by vote

On Motion of Alderman Mr. Brueggerhoff the following Ordinance was Ordained

Be it ordained by the City Council of the City of Austin Texas that hereafter it shall be lawful for the owner or his representative of any Hack Carriage or other licensed Means of transportation to demand and receive the following fares For the conveyance of each single passenger between any two points in the City limits between the hours of 6 A.M. & 8 P.M. 12 Midnight fifty Cents. second That persons desiring shall have the option of hiring any Hack Carriage or other licensed Means of transportation by the hour at the following rates between the hours of 6 A.M. & 8 P.M. one dollar per hour and between the hours of 8 P.M. and 12 Midnight one dollar and fifty Cents per hour Any owner or his representative who shall demand for such services greater pay than allowed in this and the preceding sections of this Ordinance shall be guilty of a Misdemeanor and be subject to a fine of not less than three nor more than one hundred dollars third That hereafter any driver of any Hack Carriage or other licensed Means of transportation who shall be found at a greater distance than ten feet from his vehicle the same being hitched up ready for use shall be guilty of a Misdemeanor and subject to a fine of not less than three nor more than one hundred dollars fourth That a printed copy of this Ordinance shall be carried by such licensed vehicle aforesaid posted in a conspicuous place for the inspection of the public and any licensed vehicle aforesaid which shall be found without such printed Ordinance posted as aforesaid the driver or owner thereof shall be deemed guilty of a Misdemeanor and subject to a fine of not less than three nor more than one hundred dollars

Fifth That hereafter every license granted to any vehicle described in this act shall in addition to the regular number of said license have a special number plainly expressed within the body of said license which special number shall be painted upon a conspicuous place of the vehicle aforesaid and any vehicle as aforesaid which shall be found without such special number so painted as aforesaid the driver or owner thereof shall be guilty of

a misdemeanor and be subject to a fine of not less than three nor more than one hundred dollars
Sixth

That this ordinance take effect and be in force from and after its passage

On motion of Alderman Robinson the rules were suspended and the ordinance was read for its second and third time and on motion of Alderman Madison it was finally adopted to wit

On motion of Alderman Brueggerhoff the following Ordinance was ordained

Be it ordained by the City Council of the City of Austin
First That the yearly license for theatrical exhibitions shall be two hundred and fifty dollars to be paid in advance as hereinafter provided viz one fourth in cash and shall execute his or their three promissory notes with good and solvent security or securities to be approved by the Mayor to pay the remaining three fourths of said sum in three equal payments at the commencement of each succeeding quarter of said year.

Second That the license for a life time than one year shall be five dollars for each and every exhibition

That this ordinance take effect and be in force from and after its passage
