Law RECOMMENDATION FOR COUNCIL ACTION

Subject: Authorize negotiation and execution of an amendment to an outside legal contract with Denton, Navarro, Rocha & Bernal for legal services related to Austin Firefighters Association v. City of Austin and Travis County Emergency Services District No. 9, cause no. D-1-GN-08-003824 in the 98th Judicial District Court of Travis County Texas, in an amount of \$20,000, for a total contract amount not to exceed \$73,000 (concerns an Automatic Aid Agreement with ESD No. 9).

Amount and Source of Funding: Funding in the amount of \$20,000 is available in the Fiscal Year 2008-2009 Operating Budget of the Liability Reserve Fund.

Plaintiffs filed suit, including a temporary restraining order, against the City and ESD # 9 on October 22, 2008, challenging the legality of an Automatic Aid Agreement for fire protection services which covered certain areas, including the Peninsula. The court denied the TRO, and set the case for trial on November 4, 2008. The City hired attorney Lowell Denton and his firm, Denton, Navarro, Rocha & Bernal, to represent the City at trial and to provide advice and recommendations to the City on matters related to the litigation.

This is a significant issue for the city, as we have a number of similar Automatic Aid Agreements in place. Due to the importance of the issue, the City filed a countersuit requesting the court's declaration that these agreements do not violate Civil Service law. The parties agreed to postpone the trial date from November until February 2009. The postponement was based in part on the fact that the Automatic Aid Agreement was a component of the service plan for the impending annexation of the Peninsula. The trial of this matter will take place after the date Council votes on whether to annex the Peninsula.

At this time additional funds are needed in the legal services contract with Denton, Navarro, Rocha & Bernal to continue their work on this case. Council is requested to approve an amendment to the outside counsel contract in the amount of \$20,000, for a total contract amount not to exceed \$73,000.
