## Purchasing Office RECOMMENDATION FOR COUNCIL ACTION

**Subject:** Authorize award and execution of a 24-month requirements supply contract with JL-D MANAGEMENT CO., Del Valle, TX for the purchase of flexible base in an estimated amount not to exceed \$300,800, with three 12-month extension options in an estimated amount not to exceed \$150,400 per extension option, for a total estimated contract amount not to exceed \$752,000.

**Amount and Source of Funding:** Funding in the amount of \$112,800 is available in the Fiscal Year 2008-2009 Capital Budget of Austin Energy. Funding for the remaining 15 months of the original contract period and extension options is contingent upon available funding in future budgets.

**MBE/WBE:** This contract will be awarded in compliance with Chapter 2-9D of the City Code (Minority Owned and Women Owned Business Enterprise Procurement Program). No subcontracting opportunities were identified; therefore, no goals were established for this solicitation.

This contract is for the supply of approximately 14,500 tons of flexible base to be used by Austin Energy on an as-needed basis. Flexible base is crushed limestone that is used to create a stable surface area for the construction of electrical substation facilities and electrical equipment, street cut repairs, and right-of-way improvements.

The contract includes pricing for delivered material to two City of Austin locations, as well as for City of Austin pickup of this material depending upon the City's need for specific projects.
