History

- The Travis County Healthcare District (TCHD) was established in 2004
- The District is funded primarily through property tax dollars collected in Travis County
- The City continued clinic operations pending approval of Federally Qualified Health Care (FQHC) transfer



Completed Actions

- District received FQHC provider designation
- Federal grant transferred from City to District on 2/28/09
- Required real estate transfers from City to District approved by Council 2/26/09
- 0 City's Community Care Services Department employees transitioned to District effective 3/1/09
- Records agreement approved by Council on 3/5/09

District approved on 3/26/09

Related Actions

- Council set goal for proportionate retirement for all transferred employees
- COA employees would work for either District or related 501(c) 3 Nonprofit
- COA ERS stated it would not recognize proportionate retirement for employees working for 501(c) 3 Nonprofit
- Need determinations from IRS and DOL
- ERS stated that those working for District would have proportionate retirement
- All affected employees now work for District until determinations 501(c) 3 Nonprofit gains appropriate governmental

Remaining Action Items

- Five Council Action Items for April 23, 2009
- Post-Transition Interlocal Agreement
- EMS Interlocal Agreement for services to clients District's Medical Assistance Program (MAP)
- Ryan White HIV Grants Funds (two items) for **David Powell Clinic**
- Remove Federally Qualified Health Center Board from City Code

Post Transition Services

- District will reimburse City for negative funding provided and costs incurred as of February 28, 2009 balance resulting from difference between
- Conversely, City will transfer positive balance
- City's fund transfer obligations:
- \$900K positive balance of FY 2007-08 operations
- 80% of remaining CCS CIP funds
- Approximately \$2 million
- Remaining 20% in January 2010

Post Transition Services

- Formalizes District and City agreement time regarding former CCS employee City-leave
- Telecommunications and network separation
- District will prepare Medicare/Medicaid cost and grant reports on City's behalf, subject to City approval
- District will purchase two vehicles from City

EMS Fee Agreement

- City and District agreed to capitated fee arrangement for EMS services
- \$350,000 for 12 month term beginning 3/1/09
- Fee agreement based on historic utilization
- District and City to meet during initial term of the agreement to review service utilization by MAP clients
- COA and TCHD will evaluate data no later than 90 days prior to expiration of initial term
- District to implement utilization management process

Ryan White HIV Grant Funds

- HHSD is administrative and fiscal agent for Ryan White Grant
- City will award grant funds to Community Health Centers, Inc.) CommUnityCare (Central Texas
