8	500,000 OR MORE: ELECTION FROM SINGLE-MEMBER DISTRICTS. (a) The
9	governing body of a municipality with a population of 500,000 or
10	more must consist of a mayor elected at large and at least six
11 reside	members elected from single-member districts. A member must
12	in the district the member represents.
13 <u>the</u>	(b) The municipality may provide for the staggering of
14	terms of the members of the municipality's governing body.
15 <u>of</u>	(c) A single-member district must be compact and consist
16 member	contiguous territory. To the extent practicable, all single-
17	districts must be of equal population.
18 <u>having</u>	(d) This section does not prevent a municipality from
19	additional members elected to the governing body from the

- 2 SECTION 2. A municipality to which Section 26.048, Local
- 3 Government Code, as added by this Act, applies on the effective date
 - 4 of this Act must comply with the requirements of that section
 - 5 beginning with the first general election of members to the
- 6 municipality's governing body that occurs after December 31, 2009.
- 7 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 8 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 9 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 10 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 11 Act takes effect September 1, 2009.
