Public Hearings and Possible Actions RECOMMENDATION FOR COUNCIL ACTION

Subject: Conduct a public hearing and consider an ordinance amending the Land Development Code, Chapter 25-10, to allow sidewalk signs in commercial areas of the City.

Boards and Commission Action: Reviewed by the Codes and Ordinances Subcommittee of the Planning Commission on March 17, 2009. Recommended by the Planning Commission on April 14, 2009.

On December 11, 2008, Council passed a resolution directing the City Manager to initiate a code amendment to allow sidewalk signs in the South Congress Corridor. On December 18, 2008, Council passed an additional resolution expanding that direction to allow sidewalk signs in any appropriate commercial area of the City. The resolution further directed the City Manager to review and make recommendations for amendment of existing code provisions regarding limitations on placement and location of the sign to ensure public safety.

Under City Code Chapter 25-10 (Sign Regulations), sidewalk signs are currently permitted in the downtown sign district or on property in the university neighborhood overlay (UNO) zoning district. The proposed amendments would extend these regulations to core commercial areas of the City, and impose the following minimum requirements:

o A minimum of 10 feet of clearance shall be maintained at all times, for pedestrian mobility.

o Signs shall not be placed in a manner that prevents line of sight issues for traffic.

o Signs shall not be placed within twenty (20) feet of a driveway or pedestrian crosswalk.

o Signage shall be coordinated with other right of way activities in the area.
