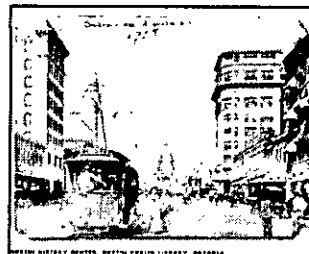

What is a Comprehensive Plan?

- **A document adopted by Council Ordinance that:**
 - Establishes a vision to guide future development within the entire City and its ETJ
 - Contains the City Council's policies and plans for growth and development
 - Sets up an ongoing process to implement, review, and update the plan





Anticipated Plan Components

- **Vision and Policy Framework**

- Lays out the vision for the community and incorporates and integrates key themes to respond to the question "*Where are we going?*"

- **Ten City Charter-Required Components**

- Addresses the question "*How do we get there?*"

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Ten Charter-Required Elements

- Future land use element
- Traffic circulation and transit element
- Wastewater, solid waste, drainage and potable water element
- Conservation and environmental resources element
- Recreation and open space element
- Housing element
- Public services and facilities element that includes but not be limited to a capital improvement program
- Public buildings and related facilities element
- Economic element for commercial and industrial development and redevelopment
- Health and human services element

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RFQ Requirements

- **Creatively and actively engage all of Austin's citizens in development of the plan**
- **Address current issues facing Austin, such as:**
 - Population growth
 - Environmental protection
 - Neighborhoods
 - Mobility
 - Affordable housing
 - Sustainability / climate change
- **Focus on plan implementation**
- **Complete plan in a timely fashion**

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RFQ Selection Process

- Standard RFQ Process
 - **Phase I**: Request for Qualifications Process and Scoring
 - **Phase II**: Panel interviews and Presentations
 - **Phase III**: Finalist Presentations to Council
 - **Phase IV**: Council Award

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RFQ Process Results

- RFQ Released: **September 30, 2008**
- Proposals Received and Evaluated during Phase I: **5**
- Short Listed for Phase II – Presentation and Interviews with Evaluation Panel: **3**
- Results of Phase I and II: **3 finalists**
- Finalist Presentations to Council: **February 11**
- Council Award: **Pending**

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Citizen Input: Activities and Results

- **March 4:** Town Lake Center Forum for public to suggest questions for Council to ask the consultants
- **March 13:** Council's questions sent to consultants
- **March 27:** Consultants submit their responses
- **April 7:** Conley-Guerrero Senior Activity Center Forum for public to comment on the finalists
- **February 27 – April 13:** Comprehensive Plan RFQ materials available on City web site
- **April 13:** Last day for public to submit comments on the finalists.
- **April 15:** All citizen comments, input submitted to Council

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March 4: Town Lake Center Forum - Results

- At least 52 attendees
- Public suggested 60 questions for the consultants, and another 22 questions for staff
- Council compiled 24 questions for the consultants
- The consultants' responses consisted of 31, 33, and 38 pages

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April 7: Conley-Guerrero Senior Activity Center Forum - Results

- At least 43 attendees
- Through April 13, 78 comments were received
 - Meeting notes, emails, comment cards, letters

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Public Comments: February 12

- Council Presentation and City Hall Open House
 - 21 written and email comments received
 - 17 comments supported ACP Vision + Planning
 - 1 supported WRT
 - 1 supported hiring a firm for the Comp Plan
 - 2 Expressed issues and concerns about the planning process and COA budget issues

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Public Comments: April 7

- Conley-Guerrero Senior Activity Center
 - Wide range of comments on process and consultants
 - 17 written and email comments received
 - 9 on process
 - 3 supported WRT
 - 1 supported ACP
 - 2 against ACP
 - 2 supported moving forward with the comp plan
