
Heritage Tree


- Creates a higher bar for removal of a Heritage Tree
- Requires an administrative variance for Heritage tree removal - findings are similar to environmental variances
- Allows requestor to appeal denial to the Land Use Commission



















Residential Subdivisions

- Requires 3 trees to be preserved or planted per lot
- Requires native/adapted species
- Incentive to preserve under-story trees which do not grow to be protected size
- Alternative compliance available
- Protected and heritage trees preservation regulations also apply


