ORDINANCE NO. 20090618-048

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING CHAPTER 2-2 OF THE CITY CODE RELATED TO CAMPAIGN FINANCE.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF AUSTIN:

- **PART 1.** City Code Subsection 2-2-2(3) (*Definitions*) is amended to read:
 - (3) CAMPAIGN PERIOD means the time period allowed in City Charter Article III, Section 8 [(F)(2)] (*Limits on Campaign Contributions and Expenditures*). [Runoff elections and recall elections have separate campaign periods.]
- **PART 2.** City Code Subsection 2-2-2(8) (*Definitions*) is amended to read:
 - (8) ELECTION or CITY ELECTION means the process by which an individual (whether opposed or unopposed) seeks election to City office, excluding an election for a [. A "runoff election" and a "recall election" are separate elections. For the purposes of this chapter, "City election" and "election" shall not include] ballot measure [measures].
- **PART 3.** City Code Section 2-2-2 (*Definitions*) is amended to add a new Subsection (22) to read as follows, and to renumber the remaining subsections accordingly:
 - (22) RUNOFF ELECTION means an election following an election in which no candidate receives a majority of the votes cast.
- PART 4. City Code Chapter 2-2 is amended to add a new Section 2-2-7 to read:

§ 2-2-7 COMMENCEMENT OF CAMPAIGN PERIOD.

- (A) A general election, special election, and a runoff election each have a separate campaign periods for purposes of City Charter Article III, Section 8 (*Limits on Campaign Contributions and Expenditures*) and this chapter.
- (B) The campaign period for a runoff election begins the day after the date of an Election at which no candidate receives the majority of the votes.
- (C) The campaign period for a special election, including a recall election, begins the day after the date the council calls the special election.
- (D) A candidate may only raise funds for an election during an authorized campaign period.

PART 5. This ordinance takes effect on June 29, 2009.
