Bat Fest, August 22, 2009

The annual event called Bat Fest will be held on August 22, 2009 at the Ann Richards Memorial Bridge. The bat colony living under the bridge is a definite source of interest and wonder for our citizens and event participants, which is why the event promoter is requesting to use this bridge as opposed to other sites.

As the event permit request was submitted prior to the codification of the revised Street Event Ordinance, the promoter needed to obtain at least 80% approval from those businesses that front the closure in order for city staff to issue an event permit. In an overwhelming show of support, the promoter has received 100% approval from the businesses and affected neighborhood organizations impacted by the closure. A list of approvals is attached for your review.


In the previous two years, a local business located on the south end of the bridge had voiced their concern about the potential loss of revenue due to the then two-day Bat Fest closure. As directed by Council last year to find resolution, a compromise was reached by moving the event to the South 1st Street Bridge in order to accommodate both the business and the event.

At the conclusion of the last years' event, Right of Way Management staff urged the promoter, French Smith IV, to immediately start discussions with the affected businesses for this year, if they intended on using the Ann Richards Memorial Bridge as their venue. The promoter was successful in reaching an agreement with the store owners, that this years' event would only be a one-day event and occur on a mutually agreed upon date (August 22nd).

With the outreach effort conducted by the promoter and with the 100% approval he received, city staff is not aware of any remaining issues that would result in hardship to an affected business or prevent the issuance of the Bat Fest permit. The promoter is adhering to the Special Event Taskforce recommendations and is planning on occupying only one of the two critical bridges (South First Street Bridge will remain open during the event).
