RESOLUTION NO.

WHEREAS, Council has adopted a Zero Waste strategy to reach its goal of achieving a 90 percent reduction in per capita solid waste disposal sent to landfills by 2040; and

WHEREAS, There is significant public interest in further reducing Austin's solid waste disposal; and

WHEREAS, Austin's current Commercial and Multi-Family Recycling Ordinance requires onsite recycling for Multi-Family properties with 100 or more units, businesses with 100 or more employees and office buildings with 100 or more employees; and

WHEREAS, On July 8, 2009 the City of Austin Solid Waste Advisory Commission approved and appointed a Recycling Ordinance Reform Subcommittee to lead a stakeholder process whose participants will include environmental advocates, development advocates, Multi-Family and Commercial property owners and managers, large Austin institutions and others with expertise and interest in recycling; **NOW THEREFORE**,

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF AUSTIN:

The Recycling Ordinance Reform Sub-committee ("Sub-committee") is hereby directed to recommend reforms to the Commercial and Multi-Family Recycling Ordinance to further reduce waste disposal and increase recycling, source reduction, reuse and composting in the City of Austin.

- The Sub-committee shall work with City staff and stakeholders to recommend a Recycling Ordinance that reflects additional measures for reducing waste disposal and increasing recycling, reuse and composting in the City of Austin.
- The Sub-committee shall base its recommendations on the Austin Zero Waste Plan and additional measures shall be compatible with the Solid Waste Management Integrated Master Plan now being developed.
- 3. The Sub-committee shall meet at least bi-monthly.
- 4. The City Manager in conjunction with the Sub-committee shall report to the City Council with an update on progress not later than November 5, 2009.
- 5. The City Manager in conjunction with the Sub-committee shall present the final policy document to City Council on or before January 1, 2010.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED:

The City Manager is hereby directed to work with the Sub-committee and provide all necessary data and resources to meet the goals of this resolution.
