#### BASIS FOR RECOMMENDATION:

This ca. 1937 house is an excellent example of Classically inspired Colonial Revival architecture and is associated with Paul B. Baker, the former superintendent of schools in Belton, Texas, J.R. "Potsy" Allen, Jr., a prominent insurance man in Austin, and Dean and Angela McWilliams, Republican political consultants and fundraisers.

#### Architecture:

Two-story, rectangular-plan, side-gabled Colonial Revival-styled brick house with a central entry with a fanlight and portico with fluted columns, Corinthian capitals with a plain neck, a frieze containing dentils, and an ornamental iron railing above;

the cornice contains a line of dentils on the front facade; 6:6 windows; the windows on the ground floor of the front façade have an ornamental raised brick segmental arched surround.

#### Historical Associations:

The house was built in 1937 by Paul B. Baker, who had moved here from Belton, Texas, having served as the superintendent of schools there. Baker had been a teacher in Belton in the 1920s, then promoted to superintendent of the school system. In 1936, he and his wife Lillie moved to Austin, where he became a publisher's representative and book salesman for the remainder of his career. He passed away in 1970; his estate sold the house to Joe Raymond "Potsy" Allen, Jr. in 1972. Potsy Allen was a native Austinite, and went into the insurance business in 1959 after graduating from the University of Texas and service in the U.S. Navy. IN 1965, he joined H.T. Hibler and George McCall to form the firm McCall, Hibler and Allen Insurance Agency with offices in the Perry-Books Building. He died in 1996 and is buried on his ranch in Luling. Potsy's widow Chris sold the house in 1998 to Dean and Angela McWilliams. Dean McWilliams is a lobbyist, Republican political consultant and fundraiser, who worked on President George W. Bush's campaign, and who with his wife, Andrea, owns McWilliams and Associates in Austin. The McWilliams sold the house in 2001 to Florence Wilkerson. Florence is the daughter of Walter Benson, a prominent automobile dealer in Austin; her late husband, Louis Scott Wilkerson was an attorney in Austin and served as assistant Secretary of State under Allen Shivers. After his death in 1997, Florence moved to this house, where she still resides.



#### Biography of Paul B. Baker

Paul Baker was listed in the 1940 Austin City Directory as a Book
Representative for Peter's Publishing Company. In 1962, he's listed as a
representative for Row Peterson Publishing. He continued to work in the
publishing field until his retirement, around 1967.

#### Biography of J.R. "Potsy" Allen

J. R. Allen, Jr., affectionately known to all as "Potsy", was a man of honor, strength, and integrity. Potsy was a native of Austin and graduated from the University of Texas in the 1950s with a degree in insurance. After graduation, Mr. Allen became a Naval officer and pilot on the U. S. Ranger (aircraft carrier). Upon his return to Austin in 1959, he entered the insurance business. Several years later, he joined H. T. Hibler and George McCall to form the firm McCall, Hibler, and Allen Insurance Agency. The firm had offices in the Perry-Brooks building for many years before moving to N. Lamar where it continues to operate.

Mr. Allen served as Property Committee Chairman of the Texas Association of Insurance Agents, and in 1972, was elected president of the Austin Association of Insurance Agents. Attending conferences all over the state and serving as liaison between between the Association and various insurance companies, Potsy gave many speeches on a wide range of insurance issues. He also served on the board of the Texas Association of Insurance Agents.

J. R. Allen, Jr. was also a cattle rancher, having his first ranch in Johnson City.

In 1985, he sold it and purchased a ranch in Luling where he continued his cattle operation until his death in 1996. Potsy is buried on this ranch.

In 2003, Mr. Allen posthumously received the "Distinguished Service Award" from the Independent Insurance Agents of Austin (IIAT).

#### Biography of Chris M. Allen

Chris M. Allen came to the United States from France when she was 18 years old. She and Potsy have six children, and she has continued to work as a rancher and partner in McCall, Hibler and Allen Insurance Agents. Chris purchased the building on N. Lamar and moved the business to it's current location.

#### Biography of Dean McWilliams

Texas-born, Austin-based, and nationally recognized, governmental affairs specialist Dean McWilliams' lobbying, campaigning and fundraising skills are drawn from his twenty years experience working in the Texas Legislature.

In 2005 the Dallas Morning News ranked McWilliams one of Texas' top grossing lobbyists. Capitol Inside, the insiders' news source of the Texas Legislature, has listed McWilliams as one of the top ten Impact Players in the industry.

McWilliams came to the attention of national media during President George W. Bush's first presidential campaign. As a Bush Pioneer, McWilliams raised over \$100,000 for the campaign, garnering coverage of his fundraising efforts on CNN.

In 2005 the Dallas Morning News ranked McWilliams as one of Texas' top grossing lobbyists, while Texans for Public Justice recognized her as the top female Texas lobbyist on their elite 'Million Dollar Lobbyists' list. Capitol Inside, the insiders' news source of the Texas Legislature, has listed McWilliams as one of the top ten Impact Players in the industry.

Always a tireless force for her clients, McWilliams has a noteworthy track record. Her ability to achieve legislative results in the face of extreme adversity has been likened to the resurrection of the biblical Lazarus. Indeed, in 2007, Capitol Inside reported on McWilliams' key outside-the-Chamber role in saving a \$3 billion cancer research package.

The national media, including Newsweek, USA Today, CNN and NPR, have reported on McWilliams' role as a leading fundraiser for President George W. Bush. Andrea and her husband Dean, along with State Representative Phil King, served as Texas co-chairs for Republican Presidential Candidate Mike Huckabee during the 2007-08 presidential cycle.

A Chief of Staff at 21, McWilliams went on to hone her private sector grassroots skills, working on major accounts including Southwestern Bell, at iconic public relations company Public Strategies, Inc. Today she is the co-founder of McWilliams & Associates, a full-service firm of governmental affairs consultants. McWilliams & Associates opened its doors when the husband and wife team of Andrea and Dean combined their talents and experience to form what has become a respected alliance, trusted at the local, state and national level.

#### Government Experience:

During her tenure at the State Capitol, Andrea was fortunate enough to work for the current Vice-Chairman of the House Appropriations Committee, State Representative Richard Raymond and the current Chairman of the powerful House Ways & Means Committee, State Representative Rene Oliveira. McWilliams also worked as a legislative aide for then Texas Senator Jim Turner during the 74th Texas legislative session, prior to his service in the U.S. Congress.

While Chief of Staff for State Rep. Mike Martin, McWilliams was responsible for the Representative's legislative program, including the complex insurance issues addressed during Rep. Martin's tenure as Vice Chair of the House Committee on Insurance. In 1994, also McWilliams worked jointly for Rep. Martin and Senator Frank Madla, former Chairman of the Senate Intergovernmental Relations Committee. Serving as Chief

Committee Clerk for the Joint Interim Committee on Health Insurance Access, she made recommendations to statewide leaders and the Texas Legislature on the future of health insurance in the state. McWilliams subsequently served on the Lieutenant Governor's Task Force on Health Care Reform.

During the 73rd Texas Legislative Session, McWilliams served as Chief of Staff for current Vice-Chairman Raymond, actively garnering legislative support for the North American Free Trade Agreement. In 1991, McWilliams played an integral part in federally mandated redistricting as Legislative Director for Representative Olivera, current Chairman of

the House Ways and Means Committee and past Chairman of both the House Mexican-American Legislative Caucus. During this time, McWilliams also worked on initiatives including environmental and regulatory issues, state appropriations and higher education.

McWilliams began her career in the Texas legislature in 1989, during the 71st Session, working as Projects Coordinator for State Representative Steve Wolens, former Chairman of both the House State Affairs Committee and the Joint Committee on Electric Restructuring.

#### Family and Community:

Raised just steps from the Texas Capitol, McWilliams now resides in Austin's historic neighborhood of Old Enfield, where she and husband Dean are raising their three children in an elegantly restored home.

A past president of Inherit Austin, McWilliams is a well-known philanthropist and community volunteer, who was named to the 2005, 2006 and 2007 Austin American Statesman Fortunate 500 lists. In 2007, McWilliams began working with The Susan G. Komen Breast Cancer Foundation and KillCancer, two nonprofit groups committed to cancer prevention.

As an active supporter of the arts, McWilliams is an inaugural member of the Long Center's Notable Women; and a member of the board of directors of Ballet Austin and Arthouse. She is also a member of the Women's Symphony League, and a past board member and current member of the Heritage Society of Austin. McWilliams serves as a board member for many other nonprofit organizations, including Texas Lyceum, the Elizabeth Ann Seton Hospital, Austin Children in Crisis, Pioneer Farms, Old Enfield Homeowner's Association, the Waterloo President's Council, and St. David's Toast of the Town Committee.

#### Biography of Florence Benson Wilkerson

A native of Austin, Florence Benson Wilkerson was born in 1920 to Walter Benson, Sr., the owner of Benson Publishing Company and Benson Motor Company, and his wife, Florence Brownlee Benson. Florence's childhood homes were on Castle Hill Street and West Lynn Street. She is a graduate of Austin High School and the University of Texas.

In 1954, Florence married Louis Scott Wilkerson. Louis was born in Beaumont in 1915, but grew up in Austin. Louis was a graduated from Austin High School in 1932, from the University of Texas in 1936, and from Harvard Law School in 1939. During World War II, Louis served in the Army in Italy, and was in the JAG Corps. After the War, Louis returned to Austin to practice law. He was Assistant Secretary of State under Texas Governor Allen Shivers, and was a longtime partner in the law firm of Sneed, Vine, Wilkerson, Selman & Perry.



Joseph Raymon "Potsy" Allen, Jr.

J.R. Allen, known to his friends as "Potsy", died November 23, 1996, at the age of 62.

A respected and well known Insurance Agent and rancher. Potsy was a native of Austin. Born December 31. 1933. to J.R. "Potsy" Allen, Sr. and Marjorie Amason Allen. He moved with his family to Roswell. New Mexico. in 1944, at the age of eleven. He graduated from the High School Division of New Mexico Military Institute, in Roswell. in 1951. His love of Austin led him to return to the University of Texas. where he became a member of the Delta Kappa Epsilon fraiernity, the Naval R.O.T.C. program, and from where he graduated with a Bachelors Degree in Business Administration. Upon graduation. Potsy was commissioned an Ensign in the Navy, serving four years as a Saval Aviator, attaining the rank of Lieutenant, and flying many missions aboard the aircraft carrier U.S.S. Ranger He married Tommye Lou Brown of El Paso, on February 4, 1956

He left Military Service in 1959, rejurned to Roswell to become a partner at the Insurance Agency of Amason McGee & Allen. In 1965, he took his family to Austin to join George McCal, and H.T. Hibler as a full partner at the Insurance Agency of McCall. Hibler & Allen. He had faithfully served there for thirty-one years.

A consummate insurance professional. Potsy was a board member of the Independent Agents of Austin, and in 1972 he served as its President. Later he served on the board of the Texas Association of Insurance Agents. Also active in Austin's social circles, he was a Rotary Club member, a former member of The Austin Country Club, and a longtime member of the Headliners Club and Tarry House.

Poisy's experiences on his family's farm as a child always stayed with him, and in 1971 he returned to those roots, buying his first ranch in the hill country near Johnson City, Texas. His love of the land, the cattle, good well water, and a hard day's work were evident to all who knew him and all who visited the ranch.

Jennifer and Justin. He leaves behind loving family and lifelong friends.
