BASIS FOR RECOMMENDATION:

This ca. 1937 house is an excellent example of Classically-inspired Colonial Revival architecture and is associated with Paul B. Baker, the former superintendent of schools in Belton, Texas, J.R. "Potsy" Allen, Jr., a prominent insurance man in Austin, and Dean and Angela McWilliams, Republican political consultants and fundraisers.

Architecture:

Two-story, rectangular-plan, side-gabled Colonial Revival-styled brick house with a central entry with a fanlight and portico with fluted columns, Corinthian capitals with a plain neck, a frieze containing dentils, and an ornamental iron railing above;

the cornice contains a line of dentils on the front facade; 6:6 windows; the windows on the ground floor of the front façade have an ornamental raised brick segmental-arched surround.

Historical Associations:

The house was built in 1937 by Paul B. Baker, who had moved here from Belton, Texas, having served as the superintendent of schools there. Baker had been a teacher in Belton in the 1920s, then promoted to superintendent of the school system. In 1936, he and his wife Lillie moved to Austin, where he became a publisher's representative and book salesman for the remainder of his career. He passed away in 1970; his estate sold the house to Joe Raymond "Potsy" Allen, Jr. in 1972. Potsy Allen was a native Austinite, and went into the insurance business in 1959 after graduating from the University of Texas and service in the U.S. Navy. IN 1965, he joined H.T. Hibler and George McCall to form the firm McCall, Hibler and Allen Insurance Agency with offices in the Perry-Books Building. 1996 and is buried on his ranch in Luling. Potsy's widow Chris sold the house in 1998 to Dean and Angela McWilliams. Dean McWilliams is a lobbyist, Republican political consultant and fundraiser, who worked on President George W. Bush's campaign, and who with his wife, Andrea, owns McWilliams and Associates in Austin. The McWilliams sold the house in 2001 to Florence Wilkerson. Florence is the daughter of Walter Benson, a prominent automobile dealer in Austin; her late husband, Louis Scott Wilkerson was an attorney in Austin and served as assistant Secretary of State under Allen Shivers. After his death in 1997, Florence moved to this house, where she still resides.



Biography of Paul B. Baker

Paul Baker was listed in the 1940 Austin City Directory as a Book
Representative for Peter's Publishing Company. In 1962, he's listed as a
representative for Row Peterson Publishing. He continued to work in the
publishing field until his retirement, around 1967.

Biography of J.R. "Potsy" Allen

J. R. Allen, Jr., affectionately known to all as "Potsy", was a man of honor, strength, and integrity. Potsy was a native of Austin and graduated from the University of Texas in the 1950s with a degree in insurance. After graduation, Mr. Allen became a Naval officer and pilot on the U. S. Ranger (aircraft carrier). Upon his return to Austin in 1959, he entered the insurance business. Several years later, he joined H. T. Hibler and George McCall to form the firm McCall, Hibler, and Allen Insurance Agency. The firm had offices in the Perry-Brooks building for many years before moving to N. Lamar where it continues to operate.

Mr. Allen served as Property Committee Chairman of the Texas Association of Insurance Agents, and in 1972, was elected president of the Austin Association of Insurance Agents. Attending conferences all over the state and serving as liaison between between the Association and various insurance companies, Potsy gave many speeches on a wide range of insurance issues. He also served on the board of the Texas Association of Insurance Agents.

J. R. Allen, Jr. was also a cattle rancher, having his first ranch in Johnson City.
In 1985, he sold it and purchased a ranch in Luling where he continued his cattle
operation until his death in 1996. Potsy is buried on this ranch.

In 2003, Mr. Allen posthumously received the "Distinguished Service Award" from the Independent Insurance Agents of Austin (IIAT).

Biography of Chris M. Allen

Chris M. Allen came to the United States from France when she was 18 years old. She and Potsy have six children, and she has continued to work as a rancher and partner in McCall, Hibler and Allen Insurance Agents. Chris purchased the building on N. Lamar and moved the business to it's current location.

Biography of Dean McWilliams

Texas-born, Austin-based, and nationally recognized, governmental affairs specialist Dean McWilliams' lobbying, campaigning and fundraising skills are drawn from his twenty years experience working in the Texas Legislature.

In 2005 the Dallas Morning News ranked McWilliams one of Texas' top grossing lobbyists. Capitol Inside, the insiders' news source of the Texas Legislature, has listed McWilliams as one of the top ten Impact Players in the industry.

McWilliams came to the attention of national media during President George W. Bush's first presidential campaign. As a Bush Pioneer, McWilliams raised over \$100,000 for the campaign, garnering coverage of his fundraising efforts on CNN.

Honored to consistently serve leaders at all levels, McWilliams was a member of the Honorary Committee for the 54th Presidential Inauguration, and now serves as a member of the Bush National Finance Committee. Dean and his wife Andrea, along with State Representative Phil King, served as Texas co-chairs for Republican Presidential Candidate Mike Huckabee during the 2007-08 presidential cycle. Both Dean and Andrea are members of the Waterloo President's Council.

Today McWilliams is the co-founder of McWilliams & Associates, a full-service firm which opened its doors when the husband and wife team of Dean and Andrea combined their talents and experience to form what has become a respected alliance, trusted at the local, state and national level.

Government Experience:

Having worked in the Texas Senate and the Texas House of Representatives, McWilliams is familiar with the inner workings of both sides of the Capitol rotunda.

From 1993 to 1995, McWilliams worked on legislative issues in the Senate for former Lieutenant Governor Bill Ratliff, the past chairman of the powerful Senate Finance Committee. In addition to handling natural resources and budget-related issues for Lieutenant Governor Ratliff, McWilliams also served on the Lieutenant Governor's Task Force on Prison Overcrowding and the Legislative Budget Board Task Force on Health Care Reform.

She is also a member of the Women's Symphony League, and a past board member and current member of the Heritage Society of Austin. McWilliams serves as a board member for many other nonprofit organizations, including Texas Lyceum, the Elizabeth Ann Seton Hospital, Austin Children in Crisis, Pioneer Farms, Old Enfield Homeowner's Association, the Waterloo President's Council, and St. David's Toast of the Town Committee.



J.R. Allen, known to his friends as "Poisy", died November 23, 1996, at the age of 62.

A respected and well known Insurance Agent and rancher. Potsy was a native of Austin. Born December 31, 1933, to J.R. "Potsy" Allen, Sr. and Marjorie Amason Allen.
