Approval of Minutes

Approve the Minutes of the Austin City Council regular meeting of November 19, 2009.

Austin Energy

2. Authorize negotiation and execution of a sponsorship agreement with AUSTIN HABITAT FOR HUMANITY, INC., for a 2010 Corporate Build of a Habitat for Humanity Home, in an amount not to exceed \$65,000. Funding in the amount of \$65,000 is available in the Fiscal Year 2009-2010 Operating Budget of Austin Energy. Recommended by the Electric Utility Commission.

Contract and Land Management

- 3. Approve a resolution waiving any interest the City of Austin might have in State property near IH 35 and Slaughter Lane to be conveyed to CAPITAL METRO as abutting owner from the State of Texas.
- 4. Authorize the negotiation and execution of a contract to purchase in fee simple Lot 1, Block B of High Vista Section One, a subdivision in Travis County, Texas, located at 7800 Spicewood Springs Road from Texas Country Bank for the Bull Creek Greenbelt in an amount not to exceed \$540,000. Funding is available in the Fiscal Year 2009-2010 Capital Budget of the Parks and Recreation Department.
- 5. Authorize execution of a construction contract with SAK/QUEST JOINT VENTURE, O'Fallon, MO, for the Downtown Wastewater Tunnel project in the amount of \$31,969,696.96 plus a \$3,196,970 contingency, for a total contract amount not to exceed \$35,166,666.96. Funding is available in the Fiscal Year 2009-2010 Capital Budget of the Austin Water Utility. Lowest bid of six (6) bids received. This contract will be awarded in compliance with Chapter 2-9A of the City Code (Minority Owned and Women Owned Business Enterprise Procurement Program) by meeting the goals with 6.92% MBE and 5.44% WBE subcontractor participation. Recommended by the Water and Wastewater Commission.

- 6. Authorize execution of a construction contract with AARON CONCRETE CONTRACTORS, LP, Austin, Texas (MBE/MH-27.00%) for Group 4 Southeast Stassney Lane from Birch Creek Drive to Teri Road Street Reconstruction, an ACCELERATE AUSTIN PROJECT, in the amount of \$749,516.35 plus a \$37,475.82 contingency, for a total contract amount not to exceed \$786,992.17. Funding in the amount of \$610,184.81 is available in the Fiscal Year 2009-2010 Capital Budget of the Public Works Department. Funding in the amount of \$176,807.36 is available in the Fiscal Year 2009-2010 Capital Budget of the Austin Water Utility. Lowest bid of six (6) bids received. This contract will be awarded in compliance with Chapter 2-9A of the City Code (Minority Owned and Women Owned Business Enterprise Procurement Program) by meeting the goals with 27.00% MBE prime contractor and 24.06% MBE and 3.37% WBE subcontractor participation. Recommended by the Water and Wastewater Commission.
- 7. Authorize negotiation and execution of a professional services agreement with AUSTIN URBAN RAIL PARTNERS, Austin, TX, for engineering services for the Austin Urban Rail Preliminary Engineering Study, in an amount not to exceed \$1,000,000. Funding is available in the Fiscal Year 2009-2010 Capital Budget of the Public Works Department. Best qualification statement of three (3) statements received. This contract will be awarded in compliance with Chapter 2-9B of the City Code (Minority Owned and Women Owned Business Enterprise Procurement Program) by meeting the goals with 16.50% MBE and 19.50% WBE subconsultant participation. Briefings on the process were presented to the Urban Transportation Commission, the Council Comprehensive Plan and the Transportation Committee on the scope prior to the release of the solicitation.

Funding is available from the Texas Department of Housing and Community Affairs Homeless Housing and Services Program Funds. The grant period is December 1, 2009 through August 31, 2011. The grant period is from March 1, 2009 to February 28, 2010. No City match is required.
- 10. Funding is available from the Texas Department of State Health Services, Women, Infants, Children Program. The grant period is October 1, 2009 through September 30, 2010. No City match is required.
- 15. Approve an ordinance accepting \$32,541 in additional grant funds from the TEXAS DEPARTMENT OF STATE HEALTH SERVICES, WOMEN, INFANTS, AND CHILDREN (WIC)PROGRAM, and amending the Fiscal Year 2009-2010 Health and Human Services Department Operating Budget Special Revenue Fund of Ordinance No. 20090914-002 to appropriate \$32,541 to maintain a service, training and resource center for WIC program mothers, local agency staff, and health providers and to add one full-time equivalent position. Approve an ordinance accepting \$114,259 in grant funds from the TEXAS DEPARTMENT OF STATE HEALTH SERVICES, DIVISION FOR PREVENTION AND PREPAREDNESS, HIV/STD PROGRAM, and amending the Fiscal Year 2009-2010 Health and Human Services Department Operating Budget Special Revenue Fund of Ordinance No. 20090914-002 to appropriate \$114,259 for the Sexually Transmitted Disease Control Program to provide clinical and preventive services to reduce the incidence of sexually transmitted diseases. Funding is available from the Texas Department of State Health Services, Division for Prevention and Preparedness, HIV/STD Program, Austin, Texas. The grant period is January 1, 2010 through December 31, 2010. No City match is required.
- 17. Approve negotiation and execution of Amendment No. 1 to the contract with FRONT STEPS, INC., for case management services at the Austin Resource Center for the Homeless for a one-year term beginning October 1, 2009, in an amount not to exceed \$113,400 for a total contract amount not to exceed \$2,306,980. Funding is available in the Fiscal Year 2009-2010 Operating Budget of the Health and Human Services Department Texas Department of Housing and Community Affairs Texas Homeless Housing and Services Program (HHSP) Special Revenue Fund. Related to Item #8.
- 18. Approve negotiation and execution of two contracts for HIV-related housing services; one with AIDS SERVICES OF AUSTIN, INC., for a 12-month term beginning October 1, 2009, in an amount not to exceed \$710,592 with two 12-month renewal options in an amount not to exceed \$710,592 per renewal term, for a total contract amount not to exceed \$2,131,776, and one with PROJECT TRANSITIONS, INC., for a 12-month term beginning October 1, 2009, in an amount not to exceed \$287,622, with two 12-month renewal options in an amount not to exceed \$287,622 per renewal term, for a total contract amount not to exceed \$862,866.
