BASIS FOR RECOMMENDATION:

The ca. 1939 house is an excellent example of Colonial Revival residential architecture and is associated with Huron W. Mills, the proprietor of Cash Lumber Company, Austin's first cash-only building materials business.

Architecture:

Two-story rectangular-plan side-gabled brick Colonial Revival-styled house with a monumental full-height flat portico supported by paired fluted Ionic columns; the central front entry is flanked with sidelights and a fanlight above; fenestration consists of 6:6 Colonial Revival-styled windows. Above the front door is a round-arched set of French doors with a balconet with ornamental metal railing.

Historical Associations:

The house was built in 1939 for Huron Weston Mills and his wife Billie Hicks Mills, who had been living at 1505 Northwood Road. Huron W. Mills was born in Water Valley, Mississippi in 1896, the son of a farmer turned carpenter. The family moved when Huron was still very young, first to Comanche County, Texas, then to San Angelo, Texas, where Huron was still living with his family in 1920. He married the former Billie Hicks in 1922, moved to Austin around 1923. He is not listed in the 1922 Austin city directory, but he and Billie appear in the 1924 directory. He was working as a book-keeper for the Kirkpatrick Lumber Company, owned by George T. Reinhardt and E.J. Bartosh. Huron and Billie lived at 810 E. 23rd Street. The Kirkpatrick Lumber Company became the Reinhardt Lumber Company by 1927; Huron Mills served as secretary/treasurer, while Frank R. Rundell, a noted Austin homebuilder, was president. George T. Reinhardt was vicepresident of the new company, which retained the old Kirkpatrick Lumber location at 501 W. 5th Street. Their ad in the 1927 city directory states: "Let your rent money pay for your home we will help you." Huron opened the Cash Lumber Company at 3004-06 Guadalupe Street (just north of the Fire Station) in 1928, and is listed as the manager, secretary/treasurer, or proprietor of the building until he closed in 1957. His business was the first lumber company in Austin operating on a strictly cash basis. Mills was also the vice-president, president, and director of the Kiwanis Club in the 1940s. He and Billie sold the house in January, 1951 to James and Georgia Neill. The Mills moved to 1508 Gaston Avenue, then to 1807 Vance Circle.

James and Georgia Neill are listed for the first time in the 1952 city directory, living at this address. He was the president of the Western Pipe Line Company, located in the Lockhart Building at 311 E. 11th Street; they were pipeline contractors. He and Georgia divorced in 1953; Georgia remained in the house, while James, and new wife Geraldine, moved to 407 W. 18th Street. James is no longer listed in Austin city directories after 1952, although he and Geraldine do appear in the 1958 directory, but as living in Dallas. He was the proprietor, with Charles LeNoir, of the Western Construction Company, a pipeline contractor, with offices at 702 Colorado Street. Georgia Neill lived in this house until 1970. Philip Cannon and his wife Marie owned the house in the early 1970s; they sold the house to William O. and Dorothy Nell Karcher in 1975. Karcher, born in 1919 in Lee County, Texas, first appears in Austin city directories in 1953, living at 4004

Brookview Road and working as a deputy collector for the IRS. They moved to 4001 Crescent Drive by 1954, and then to a rural route in the 1960s before purchasing this property. He continued to work for the IRS until his retirement.



The 1930 U.S. Census shows Huron and Billie Mills living in a rented house at 1017 W. 30th Street. They were both then 33 and had two children: Mary, 6, and Madison, 5. Huron Mills had been born in Mississippi; Billie Mills had been born in Texas, as had both the children. He was listed as the proprietor of a lumber yard.

The 1920 U.S. Census shows Huron Mills living in the home of his parents, Claude and Martha, in San Angelo, Texas. Claude Mills was a house carpenter; Huron is listed as a ranch laborer. He was single.

The 1910 U.S. Census shows 13-year old Huron Mills in the home of his parents in San Angelo, Texas; his father was listed as a carpenter in a planing mill.

The 1900 U.S. Census shows Huron Mills as the 4-year old son of C.S. and Martha Mills, living in Comanche County, Texas. C.S. Mills was listed as a farmer living in a rented house.

Huron's 1918 draft registration card indicates that he was born in Water Valley, Mississippi in 1896, and currently lived in the home of his father in San Angelo, Texas. He worked for the Cox-Rushing Company in San Angelo, and was single.

Biography of Huron W. Mills

Huron W. Mills was the owner of the Cash Lumber Company, which opened for business in April of 1928. The business was located at 3004-3006 Guadalupe, and operated on a 'strictly cash' basis. Their advertisement read:

YOU PAY CASH FOR YOUR GROCERIES

WHY NOT YOUR LUMBER TOO?


WE CAN SAVE YOU AS MUCH AS YOUR MONEY

WOULD EARN IN 2 YEARS IN A SAVINGS ACCOUNT

It was Austin's first and only lumber yard operating on a strictly cash basis. Mr. Mills owned the business at least through 1949 and possibly longer.

Huron Mills was born in Mississippi and came to the University of Texas where he graduated in 1924. He married Billie Hicks and they had two children. In 1939, they received a building permit to build a 2 story brick veneer and frame residence with attached garage at 2603 Wooldridge. The Mills lived in this lovely house for 12 years.

Huron Mills was President, Vice-President and Director of the Austin Kiwanis Club. He was also a trustee at University Methodist Church and former Director of the Chamber of Commerce.
