

Priority Needs

Corporation for Supportive Housing (CSH) - Permanent Supportive Housing:

- 2010 report commissioned by ECHO, Re-entry Roundtable, & Mayor's Mental Health Task Force to recommend PSH needs for our community
- Corporation for Supportive Housing (CSH) estimates 1900 units needed in 10 years
- CSH report recommends short-term production goal (4 years): 350 units




Homeless Services Continuum Funding \$11,152,000

Recommendations for Future Investment

Priority Gaps in Homeless Services Continuum

- Permanent Supportive Housing
 - Chronically homeless individuals who are frequent users of shelter & services at ARCH
 - Individuals re-entering the community from the criminal justice system
- Short-Term Shelter & Services for Families with Children
