## **RESOLUTION NO.**

WHEREAS, Dr. John Jarvis Seabrook was a prominent Black pastor and president emeritus of Huston-Tillotson University who joined forces with a group of community activists called the Austin Black Assembly in their fight to have a street renamed for slain civil rights leader Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr. that made history; and

**WHEREAS,** Opposition arose to the renaming of 19<sup>th</sup> Street, which at that time was the only street that crossed both East and West Austin; and

**WHEREAS,** on May 1, 1975, Dr. Seabrook testified eloquently before the Austin City Council that making 19<sup>th</sup> St. MLK Jr., Blvd. only on the east side of IH-35 would denigrate the memory of a man who had dedicated his life to crossing such barriers; and,

WHEREAS, At that council meeting, Dr. Seabrook suffered a heart attack from which he could not be revived, but which ultimately settled the issue of the street renaming; and,

WHEREAS, Dr. Seabrook should be remembered as a man who gave his life to bring East and West Austin together;

WHEREAS, to raise awareness of this important chapter in Austin's history, a group of Austinites from both sides of the Interstate organized a celebration of the 35<sup>th</sup> Anniversary of Dr. Seabrook's death; NOW, THEREFORE,

## BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF AUSTIN:

The Austin City Council honors the memory of Dr. John Jarvis Seabrook and his effort to bridge East and West Austin by renaming the Martin Luther King, Jr. Boulevard Bridge over IH35 "JJ Seabrook Bridge".

## BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED:

The City Manager is directed to coordinate with the Texas Department of Transportation and furnish a suitable identifying memorial marker or markers acceptable to the department which will be appropriately erected to identify the bridge as the JJ Seabrook Bridge in accordance with Chapter 225, Texas Transportation Code and Title 43, Texas Administrative Code, Section 25.9.
