BASIS FOR RECOMMENDATION:

Architecture:

One-story, rectangular-plan, side-gabled frame bungalow with a partial-width front-gabled independent porch on battered posts and stone piers with a brick cap and a vertical baluster railing. Fenestration consists of 1:1 wood-frame, wood-sash units in single and multiple configurations; the entry is flanked with sidelights. A battered stone chimney pierces the north side gable of the house.

Historical Associations:

The house was built around 1930 for Herman F. and Dorothy Voss. Herman F. Voss was the son of Herman H. Voss, who with Otto L. Koock, founded Voss & Koock, a wholesale hardware, crockery, and house furnishings business located at the corner of 3rd and San Jacinto in 1898. The firm was reputed to have the largest selection of fancy china in Central Texas. Herman H. Voss passed away in 1932. After that, Koock continued to operate the Koock Hardware Company at the old 3rd and San Jacinto location, while Herman F. Voss started the H.H. Voss Company at 511 Congress Avenue. By 1937, the H.H. Voss Company was maintaining its offices on Congress Avenue, but also had moved back into the 3rd and San Jacinto warehouse,

and remained there until the early 1940s. The H.H. Voss Company handled wholesale and retail hardware, glassware, stoves, paper bags, and expanded into hotel supplies.

Herman F. Voss was born in Austin and attended St. Edward's University (then St. Edward's College). He lived with his parents at 1304 West Avenue until he married in 1928; he and his wife Dorothy then moved to 700 Highland Avenue, before purchasing this property in 1929. The 1930 U.S. Census report shows Herman and Dorothy Voss living on Northwood Road, which had no house numbers yet. They are listed as the owners of the house, which was worth \$6,000. Herman F. Voss was then 24; Dorothy was 23; they had been married for 2 years, and had a 1-year old son, Herman F. Voss, Jr. Voss is listed as a shipping clerk for a hardware company, which corresponds to the city directory listings for the same period: he worked as a book-keeper and shipping clerk for Voss & Koock. After his father passed away in 1932, Herman F. started the H.H. Voss Company, which was renamed the H.F. Voss Company around 1946, when they dropped hardware and hotel supplies from the business and began concentrating more fully on china, glassware, pottery, and household furnishings. The company stayed in business until the early 1950s. From the mid-1950s through his retirement, Herman F. Voss worked as the business manager for the First United Methodist Church. He died in 1981.

After his father's death, Herman F. Voss' mother, Ida, remained in the old two-story family house on West Avenue. Around 1939, she and Herman F. swapped houses – he moved to West Avenue while Ida Voss moved into this Northwood Road house. After her death in 1949, the house was sold to Mrs. Nora Drake, a widow who worked for the State Teacher Retirement System. Nora Drake and her husband Ezra L. Drake are listed in the 1920 U.S. Census report, when they were living in Liberty County, Texas, and he was an oil operator. Ezra L. Drake was born in 1890 in Missouri; at the time of his World War I draft registration in 1918, he was working as an oil and gas driller for the Minor Oil Company in Sour Lake, Texas. He apparently passed away in the 1920s; Nora Drake is listed as a widowed grammar school teacher in Liberty, Texas in the 1930 U.S. Census report. She passed away in Austin in 1966. The Drake family held on to the house until 1996; they had renters in the house in the mid-1960s, including Ed Hill, the owner of Austin Awning and Bedding, and Louis Hill, who worked at Charles E. Davis Hardware Company. The current owner purchased the house in 1998.



Biography of Herman Heinrich Voss

- H.H. Voss came from Bremen, Germany, and became a U.S. citizen March 8, 1893.
- In September of 1898, a New York paper, The House Furnishing Review, announced that "H.H. Voss will soon open a china and glass store at Austin, Texas"
- Voss and Koock had the largest selection of Haviland and fancy china in Central Texas
- . H.H. Voss was the buyer for the firm and had already been in the business for over 20 years
- Voss and Koock were known as two of the most progressive young businessmen in Austin
 "who stood at the front of everything for the advancement and upbuilding of the city"

Biography of Herman F. Voss

- Around 1930, Herman F. Voss began his career in Austin as a shipping clerk for Voss and Koock, a wholesale hardware store at 301 E. 3rd Street and owned by his father
- Herman was the son of Herman H. and Ida Voss
- Herman F. became the president of the H.H. Voss Company at 511 Congress Ave.

Biography of Ida Voss

- Ida Voss was born in Manchaca
- Ida was a charter member of the Austin Women's club which was established December 13, 1928
- Ida and Herman H. bought the "old north castle" at 708-710 San Antonio Street in 1929 (which was listed in the National Register of Historical Buildings in 1969)

Biography of Dorothy Voss

• Dorothy (wife of Herman F. Voss) was president of the Settlement Club in Austin.

Biography of Mrs. Nora Drake

 Nora Drake (the widow of Ezra L. Drake) worked for the State Teacher Retirement System.

Biography of Ed Hill

• Ed Hill owned Austin Awning and Bedding, and later was with Auto Transit Service. He then became a salesman for the Charles P. Davis Hardware store.

Biography of Louis E. & Henri Hill

· Louis Hill was also listed at the Charles P. Davis Hardware store.

Biography of Martha Hill Whitcomb

- Martha Hill Whitcomb was born on October 20, 1936 to Ed and Henri Mae Hill in Austin.
 She died after a brief illness on April 8, 2009.
- Martha graduated from Austin High and The University of Texas.
- Martha enjoyed an extensive career in retail baby store management and was an avid genealogist.

Biography of Susan Duffy Buehler

- Susan Duffy Buehler was raised in the Dallas area along with her three siblings. She
 graduated from Texas Tech and Rice Universities with degrees in Spanish, and
 subsequently enjoyed a long career in human resources management with several venturefunded Austin-based start-up companies. She and then-husband Dale Buehler spent ten
 years in Houston before moving to Austin to raise their children, purchasing the home at
 1501 Northwood in 1998.
- The Buehler family spent several years undertaking a careful restoration of the house while
 Dale attended architecture school at UT. The house is the childhood home for their
 daughter Elizabeth and son Joseph. Lizzie, Joe, and mom Susie, the present owner, make
 their home at 1501 Northwood today.
