SUBJECT: Proposed 2010 Mobility Bond Summary Statistics

This is a summary overview of the proposed Preliminary 2010 Transportation Bond Package. The summary is provided in a question and answer format, based on comments the Austin Transportation Department received at the public forum held June 17, 2010, where approximately 140 citizens participated in an open house format discussion of the proposed bond program.

Proposed Bond:

- \$84,845,000 Proposal
 - Roads
 - Sidewalks
 - Bicycle facilities
 - Trails
 - Transit
- 30 named projects funded by the proposal.
- 21 additional projects funded through flexible program funding.
- Funds for ADA, signal, and sidewalk program to be assigned over the next two years.
- New capacity as well as preservation of existing assets.
- No Urban Rail.



Regional Spending by Mode




Question: What about regional freeways? How are investments from this bond being leveraged with regional investments to address congestion issues on the regional freeway system?

Answer:

The City of Austin is partnering with our regional transportation providers such as the Texas Department of Transportation (TxDOT), the Central Texas Regional Mobility Authority (CTRMA) and Capital Metro to address regional mobility needs. As part of the 2010 bond proposal and other investments, such as the Loop1/Ben White Boulevard pass-through finance agreement, the City of Austin is proposing to contribute significantly to the regional proposals to address congestion on the freeway and regional mobility network. A graphic illustrating the proposed investments being made in the regional freeway network is shown below.


Question: How are City of Austin funds being leveraged with other regional transportation providers to maximize the benefits to the region?

Answer:

The proposed bond program, along with current City of Austin investments anticipated to reach construction between now and 2018 total approximately \$95 million. This estimate does not include the potential for a future bond program in the 2012 to 2015 time frame.

Regionally, capital investments of approximately \$1.76 billion are being contemplated. Additional investments at the County level are not totaled as part of this estimate, but would increase the overall regional investment when incorporated.

Monies allocated for the projects listed in the draft mobility bond proposal are all expected to be obligated over the next two years. Items coded in pink are priority projects for which direct funding is not recommended or for which bond funding cannot be used. For instance, it is not advisable to fund planning studies and other projects with general obligation bond funds. However, as these planning studies are crucial to developing solutions for the long-term bond mobility of Austin, the final recommendation for bond mobility funding will identify alternate sources of funding for these important projects as well.
